ORDINANCE NO. 17-02

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING ACCEPTANCE OF DEED OF DEDICATION WITH REGARD TO BLOCK 4302, LOT 4 (FORMERLY BLOCK 1301, LOT 1) OLD CORLIES AVENUE, A/K/A GREENVILLE CEMETERY TO THE TOWNSHIP OF NEPTUNE

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Neptune, County of Monmouth and State of New Jersey that pursuant to State Statute allowing municipalities to accept and to purchase dedicated property for public use, the Township hereby authorizes and accepts a Deed of Dedication to Block 4302, Lot 4 (Formerly Block 1301, Lot 1) located on Old Corlies Avenue and described in certain historical accounts as the Greenville Cemetery at Corlies Avenue, Neptune, New Jersey, for public purposes.

RECLASSIFY CUSTODIAN FROM PART-TIME TO FULL-TIME STATUS
