ORDINANCE 26-01

**ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH
A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)**

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Neptune in the County of Monmouth finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2026 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Committee hereby determines that a 3.5 % increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$653,528.93 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Committee hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Neptune, in the County of Monmouth, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2026 budget year, the final appropriations of the Township of Neptune shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5 %, amounting to \$1,524,900.83 and that the CY 2026 municipal budget for the Township of Neptune be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.

Section 9-9.4 of the Code of the Township of Neptune is hereby amended and supplemented by deleting the existing Section 9-9.4 in its entirety and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

"§ 9-9.4. Application for Retirement Benefits.

An employee having completed the required number of years of service, and having attained the specified age, under a state-authorized retirement program or is retired on approved disability, may apply for retirement as provided by the plan and state law. The Township Committee shall provide post-retirement medical and/or prescription benefits to eligible retirees and eligible dependents, as permitted by law, on such terms and conditions (including eligibility, duration, and the level of Township contribution) as may be established and amended from time to time by resolution of the Township Committee. The Township Committee may provide such benefits through the New Jersey State Health Benefits Program pursuant to P.L. 1999, c. 48 ("Chapter 48"), when applicable, or through any other lawful plan, carrier, program, or arrangement, and may change the plan, carrier, benefit design, or arrangement, at its discretion, by resolution. In the event the Township changes insurance carriers or benefit arrangements, substantially similar benefits will be provided."

SECTION 2. REPEALER.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY.

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance, and the same shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication according to law.

FLORENTINE INVESTMENT GROUP, LLC**

WHEREAS, the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1, et seq., as amended and supplemented (the "Act"), provides a process for municipalities to participate in the redevelopment and improvement of areas designated as areas in need of redevelopment or as areas in need of rehabilitation; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Neptune ("Township") desires that the land located in an area which has been determined to be an area in need of redevelopment in accordance with the Act, currently designated on the Tax Map of the Township of Neptune as Block 5602, Lot 33 (the "Project Site") be redeveloped in accordance with the Redevelopment Plan for the North Channel of the Shark River, revised November 27, 2006, adopted by the Township pursuant to Ordinance No. 07-10 on February 26, 2007 and as may be amended from time to time (the "Redevelopment Plan"); and

WHEREAS, on or about October 14, 2025, Florentine Investment Group, LLC submitted to the Township a Pre- Submission Form, dated September 23, 2025 ("Proposal"), seeking to be designated as the Redeveloper for the Project Site and outlining its intention to redevelop the Project Site, together with a "Concept Plan B" drawing, prepared by Dynamic Engineering, dated July 3, 2023, last revised October 6, 2025 and a "Schematic Mixed-Use Structure" plan, prepared by Paul A. Damiano, Architects, LLC, dated September 4, 2025 (collectively, the "Concept Plan"); and

WHEREAS, the Project Site consists of an existing 4,811 sq. ft. one-story restaurant (the "Park Social") together with fifty-seven (57) parking spaces and vacant land which is owned by Florentine Investment Group, LLC; and

WHEREAS, Florentine Investment Group, LLC proposes to redevelop the vacant land portion of the Project Site with a new three-story mixed-use building, consisting of: (1) eight (8) two-bedroom market rate rental apartments (4 units proposed on the second floor and 4 units proposed on the third floor) over a proposed 4,904 sq. ft. commercial/retail area on the first floor; (2) thirty-five (35) new parking spaces for the mixed-use building, of which sixteen (16) parking spaces would be reserved for the residential apartments; (3) four new parking spaces for the Park Social restaurant, which when combined with the existing fifty-seven (57) parking spaces on the Project Site, would yield a total of sixty-one (61) parking spaces for the Park Social restaurant; (4) a concrete sidewalk along New York Road as depicted in the Concept Plan; (5) milling, overlaying and restriping of the existing parking lots and such improvements as further set forth in the Proposal and as generally depicted in the Concept Plan (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Township's Redevelopment Committee has vetted the Proposal and has met with Florentine Investment Group, LLC to further discuss the Proposal and the Concept Plan and the implementation of the Redevelopment Plan, generally; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Neptune (the "Township Committee") desire to designate Florentine Investment Group, LLC as the Conditional Redeveloper of the Project Site
