## TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE MEETING – DECEMBER 23, 2013

Mayor Houghtaling called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. and requested the Clerk to call the roll. The following members were present: J. Randy Bishop, Dr. Michael Brantley, Mary Beth Jahn, Kevin B. McMillan and Mayor Eric J. Houghtaling.

Also present at the dais were Richard J. Cuttrell, Municipal Clerk; Vito D. Gadaleta, Township Administrator; Michael J. Bascom, Chief Financial Officer; and Gene Anthony, Township Attorney.

Mayor Houghtaling announced that the notice requirements of R.S. 10:4-18 have been satisfied by the publication of the required advertisement in the Asbury Park Press on January 4, 2013 and The Coaster on January 3, 2013, posting the notice on the Board in the Municipal Complex, and filing a copy of said notice with the Municipal Clerk.

The following items were discussed in open session:

The Committee discussed a request from Neptune Fire District #1 for a salary increase for the Fire Commissioners. The District submitted salary information from other districts in support of their request. Mr. Gadaleta stated that the request is a 40% salary increase. Dr. Brantley asked if the submitted salary information was for fire districts that are comparable to Neptune. Mr. Bishop suggested that Mr. Gadaleta discuss the matter with the Commissioners. The Mayor stated that he does not like to compare with other Fire Districts because the Commissioners were aware of the annual salary when they ran for elected office. Mr. Gadaleta stated that he will obtain more information on the districts that were used as comparables. Ms. Jahn requested Mr. Gadaleta also confirm that the District is not in need of anything else such as equipment.

The Mayor stated that many residents are requesting a second green recycling container. The Township charges for a second refuse container, but asked the Committee what should be done in this instance because there is no cost to the Township to dispose of recycling. He suggested that the Township and resident share in the \$90 cost of the container with the Township's share being borne through the Recycling Tonnage Grant. The Mayor recommended 60% of the cost to the homeowner and 40% to the Township. The Committee indicated agreement and Mr. Cuttrell will prepare the necessary resolution for the Reorganization meeting.

Mr. Gadaleta reviewed a list of pending capital items and provided a status for each. Mr. Bascom stated that there is a chance that change order can be done to repair an additional portion of the Wesley Lake wall. Mr. Gadaleta stated that he is looking into the possibility of an interlocal agreement to use an electrician on staff with the City of Asbury Park for the installation of Broadway lighting.

Mr. Bascom stated that the Police Department has been regularly performing traffic/speeding enforcement. Four additional Special officers have been doing traffic enforcement around schools and habitual speeding areas. Mr. Bascom added that he found portable speed tables/cushions that can be moved around to different streets. He is still researching the options and will bring more information to the Committee at a later date.

## AUTHORIZE AN EXECUTIVE SESSION AS AUTHORIZED BY THE OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT

Mr. Bishop offered the following resolution, moved and seconded by Ms. Jahn, that it be adopted:

WHEREAS, Section 8 of the Open Public Meetings Act, Chapter 231, P.L. 1975, permits the exclusion of the public from a meeting in certain circumstances; and,

WHEREAS, this public body is of the opinion that such circumstances presently exist,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Neptune, County of Monmouth, as follows:

1. The Public shall be excluded from discussion of and action upon the hereinafter specified subject matters.

2. The general nature of the subject matter to be discussed is as follows:

Personnel – 2014 appointments Litigation – Update on pending litigation Potential Litigation – Responsible Contractor/quality assurance policy/ordinance Contract negotiations – Extension of Housing Incentive Program for Schoolhouse Square

3. It is anticipated at this time that the above stated subject matters will be made public when matters are resolved.

4. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

The resolution was adopted on the following vote: Bishop, aye; Brantley, aye; Jahn, aye; McMillan, aye; and Houghtaling, aye.

The Committee entered executive session for discussion on closed session matters.

The Committee reviewed appointments for the 2014 reorganization meeting.

The Committee indicated agreement to extend the Housing Incentive Program for Schoolhouse Square and took action by resolution during the business portion of the meeting.

Dr. Brantley stated that he and Mr. Gadaleta have been working on revisions and updates to the Township's personnel ordinance. A draft copy will be sent to the Committee members for review.

The Committee returned to the Meeting Room for the regular portion of the meeting.

Mayor Houghtaling called the meeting to order and requested the Clerk to call the roll. The following members were present: J. Randy Bishop, Dr. Michael Brantley, Mary Beth Jahn, Kevin B. McMillan, and Mayor Eric J. Houghtaling.

Also present at the dais were Richard J. Cuttrell, Municipal Clerk; Vito D. Gadaleta, Township Administrator; Michael J. Bascom, Chief Financial Officer; and Gene Anthony, Township Attorney.

After a moment of Silent Prayer and the Flag Salute, the Mayor asked the Clerk to indicate the fire exits.

## REPORT OF THE CLERK

The Clerk stated that the following reports and communications are on file in his office:

Letters from Donato Saponaro, Principal, Shark River Hills School, and Pam East, 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade Teacher, thanking Mayor Houghtaling for conducting a lesson on local government and inviting Mrs. East's 3<sup>rd</sup> grade students to lead the Flag Salute at the last Township Committee meeting.

## COMMENTS FROM THE DAIS

Randy Bishop stated he attended various events such as Neptune's First Aid holiday party, Toys for Tots Drive which was conducted by our local police, the Senior Center Open House, the West Neptune holiday party which was wonderful. He also attended the joint meeting between Brookdale Community College Trustees and Neptune Board of Education. He applauded both for launching the Poseidon Project which would allow 25 students who were eligible to qualify in getting both their high school diploma and associates agree at the same time. He attended the Ocean Grove Homeowners Association event which was a special thank you to Fran Paladino who will be leaving Ocean Grove and moving to Florida. He stated Mr. Paladino has been valuable to the community

and to the governing body because he served on the Committee for a short time. He also stated he had a great time with MURC at their Jeans and Jewels event. He also announced the retirement of Noel Clark after 18 years of employment with the Township. Today he also visited Santa at the VFW Post 2639. He thanked Dan and the First Lady for representing both him and the Mayor at a Chamber of Commerce Dinner while they went to a meeting.

WHEREAS, the costs associated these services will be paid out of the redemption monies received from the In Rem Tax Foreclosure proceedings,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Township Committee of the Township of Neptune hereby authorizes execution of an agreement with Keith Bonchi, Esq., to perform In Rem Tax Foreclosure proceedings as authorized by the Township Committee's adoption of the 2013 Tax Foreclosure List at an amount not to exceed \$10,000.00 to be paid out of the redemption monies received from the In Rem Tax Foreclosure proceedings,; and,

#### AUTHORIZE FOURTH MODIFICATION OF MORTGAGE AND MORTGAGE NOTE BETWEEN TRF DP RIDGE AVENUE, LLC AND THE TOWNSHIP OF NEPTUNE

WHEREAS, the Township of Neptune is the owner and holder of a certain Promissory Note

totaling \$400,000.00 secured by a certain Mortgage for such sum made by TRF DP Ridge Avenue, LLC to the Township dated February 19, 2009 and recorded April 8, 2009 in Mortgage Book 8766, Page 4660 on the real estate described in said Mortgage; and,

WHEREAS, said Note and Mortgage requires principal payment in the amount of \$14,285.71 to the Township of Neptune upon closing of the sale of each of the final twenty-eight (28) residential units of the fifty-eight (58) unit project as that term is defined in a certain Redevelopment Agreement as amended and dated as of February 11, 2008 between the Township and TRF DP Ridge Avenue, LLC; and,

WHEREAS, in December, 2011, TRF DP Ridge Avenue, LLC requested as a result of the down housing market to amend the aforesaid Promissory Note and Mortgage to allow each purchaser of housing units to assume \$20,000.00 as the total debt to the Township reducing TRF DP Ridge Avenue, LLC's obligation by \$714.29 for each unit applicable to the sale of units only between January 1, 2012 and June 30, 2012 in order to encourage the sale of such units; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Committee adopted Resolution #12-65 on January 9, 2012 which authorized execution and adoption of an amended Note and Mortgage Note to allow for this program between January 1, 2012 and June 30, 2012; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Committee adopted Resolution #12-274 on July 9, 2012 which authorized execution and adoption of a second amended Note and Mortgage Note to allow for this program between July 1, 2012 and December 31, 2012; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Committee adopted Resolution #13-257 on May 13, 2013 which authorized execution and adoption of a second amended Note and Mortgage Note to allow for this program between January 1, 2013 and December 31, 2013; and,

WHEREAS, the Township desires to extend this program through December 31, 2014,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Township Committee of the Township of Neptune hereby authorizes the execution and adoption of a fourth amended Note and Mortgage Note from the original Note and Mortgage Note of February 9, 2009 so as to allow between January 1, 2014 and December 31, 2014 only that new purchasers of units in the Ridge Avenue Redevelopment Area also known as Schoolhouse Square provide the Township with a Secondary Mortgage of \$20,000.00 as part of the total debt due and owing from TRF DP Ridge Avenue, LLC to Neptune Township under the \$400,000.00 Note and Mortgage of February 9, 2009 reducing TRF DP Ridge Avenue, LLC's obligation to the Township by \$714.29 for each unit; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Township Committee hereby authorizes the Mayor and Clerk to execute the amended Modified Mortgage and Mortgage Note prepared by TRF DP Ridge Avenue, LLC and reviewed by the Township Attorney; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Business Administrator, Chief Financial Officer, Community Programs Coordinator, and Township Attorney.

## AUTHORIZE A PUBLIC AUCTION OF SURPLUS VEHICLES
