TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE MEETING - AUGUST 13, 2018

Deputy Mayor Rizzo called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. and requested the Clerk to call the roll. The following members were present: Dr. Michael Brantley, Robert Lane, Jr., and Carol Rizzo. Absent: Kevin B. McMillan and Mayor Nicholas Williams.

Also present at the dais were Richard J. Cuttrell, Municipal Clerk; Vito D. Gadaleta, Business Administrator; and Gene Anthony, Township Attorney.

Deputy Mayor Rizzo announced that the notice requirements of R.S. 10:4-18 have been satisfied by the publication of the required advertisement in the Asbury Park Press and The Coaster on January 4, 2018, posting the notice on the Board in the Municipal Complex, and filing a copy of said notice with the Municipal Clerk.

The following items were discussed in open session:

Lauren Kaapcke, Township Intern, presented an update on the Township's Sustainable New Jersey efforts. She stated that the Township is working on reducing energy usage. The recent boiler project saved \$8,000 annually and consumes less gas and electricity. The energy star score for the Municipal Building went from 60 to 67. She suggested lighting upgrades for more savings. The construction of the new Public Works facility will also provide energy savings and is eligible for \$70,000 in Pay for Performance grants. The lighting upgrades will get the Township close to an energy star score of 75 points. The Township will be applying for Sustainable NJ bronze level status.

The Committee discussed a fee for weddings performed by the Mayor or Deputy Mayor. Mr. Anthony stated that the Local Finance Board addressed the issue in 2007. A municipality can charge for weddings. A fee ordinance is required and the money must go to the current fund. The Mayor can also establish hours which weddings are performed. Mr. Anthony added that many towns have fees so many people come to Neptune for the ceremony because there is no charge. Dr. Brantley stated that this topic should wait until all of the Committee members are present.

AUTHORIZE AN EXECUTIVE SESSION AS AUTHORIZED BY THE OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT

Mr. Lane offered the following resolution, moved and seconded by Dr. Brantley, that it be adopted:

WHEREAS, Section 8 of the Open Public Meetings Act, Chapter 231, P.L. 1975, permits the exclusion of the public from a meeting in certain circumstances; and,

WHEREAS, this public body is of the opinion that such circumstances presently exist,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Neptune, County of Monmouth, as follows:

1. The Public shall be excluded from discussion of and action upon the hereinafter specified subject matters.

2. The general nature of the subject matter to be discussed is as follows:

Litigation – OPRA/common law document litigation

Personnel – Recommendations for hiring of Recreation Coordinator at Senior Center and Customer Service Representative in Code/Construction

Litigation – Insurance broker present to discuss property insurance renewal and a non-covered claim

3. It is anticipated at this time that the above stated subject matters will be made public when matters are resolved.

4. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

The resolution was adopted on the following vote: Brantley, aye; Lane, aye; and Rizzo, aye.

Mr. Anthony stated that a resolution is on the regular meeting to appeal a ruling by Judge

Thornton. In the recent case regarding the release of internal affairs document for Philip Seidle, the Judge ruled in favor of the Township on the OPRA side of the case, but the Township lost the common law argument. However, Judge Thornton awarded fees based on common law. The awarding of fees to Plaintiff is specific to OPRA law.

The Committee entered executive session for discussion on closed session matters.

The Committee reviewed recommendations for hiring of a Recreation Coordinator at the Senior Center and Customer Service Representative in Code/Construction and took action by resolutions at the regular meeting.

The Committee returned to the Meeting Room for the regular portion of the meeting.

Deputy Mayor Rizzo called the meeting to order and requested the Clerk to call the roll. The following members were present: Dr. Michael Brantley, Robert Lane, Jr., and Carol Rizzo. Absent: Kevin B. McMillan and Mayor Nicholas Williams.

Also present at the dais were Richard J. Cuttrell, Municipal Clerk; Vito D. Gadaleta, Business Administrator; and Gene Anthony, Township Attorney.

After a moment of Silent Prayer and the Flag Salute, the Mayor asked the Clerk to indicate the fire exits.

The Clerk stated, "Fire exits are located in the rear of the room and to my right. In case of fire you will be notified by bell and or public address system, then proceed to the nearest smoke-free exit"

Deputy Mayor Rizzo announced that the notice requirements of R.S. 10:4-18 have been satisfied by the publication of the required advertisement in the Asbury Park Press and The Coaster on January 4, 2018, posting the notice on the Board in the Municipal Complex, and filing a copy of said notice with the Municipal Clerk. In addition, the meeting agenda, resolutions and ordinances are posted online at <u>www.neptunetownship.org</u>.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mr. Lane offered a motion, seconded by Dr. Brantley, to approve the minutes of the meetings held on July 9th and July 24th. All were in favor.

COMMENTS FROM THE DAIS

Dr. Brantley attended National Night Out and enjoyed the event. Redevelopment meetings continue to make progress.

Mr. Lane attended National Night Out and thanked the Police Department for their efforts. He announced that there will be a Memorial Day service at Veterans Park. The 4th annual Pound the Pavement event is coming up and ads are going out. He attended various outreach events in the community including churches that offer food, clothing, and bicycles. He appealed for baby diapers which are need at the food pantry at 1710 Columbus Avenue.

Ms. Rizzo met with Shark River Hills residents on code enforcement issues. Bill Doolittle, Director of Code, is working to resolve these issues.

PUBLIC COMMENTS ON RESOLUTIONS

Dorothy Argyros, 2100 Rutherford Avenue, stated that she resigned from the Senior Center in protest of the removal of Brian Butch. She saw a document on the internet which is a national plan for military takeover and internment for many people. In regards to the Seidle OPRA litigation, she said it would be cheaper just to pay the Asbury Park Press and government is secretive.

Hank Coakley, Valley Road, asked for more information on the resolution to authorize medication in a legal matter. Mr. Anthony stated that this involves a zoning violation at Stumpy's on Route 35. The lawsuit was filed to stop them from expanding a non-conforming use and now mediation is being used to resolve the matter.

Richard Williams, 1 Abbott Avenue, asked for information on Seidle OPRA litigation. Mr.

Anthony stated that an OPRA request was filed for Mr. Seidle internal affairs reports. Access was denied because OPRA law specifically exempts internal affairs reports. Judge Thornton ruled that the Township was correct under OPRA but can be released under common law because the public's right to know outweighs the confidentiality of the document. The Judge also awarded partial attorney fees, but there is no provision for a fee award under common law. The Township feels an obligation to appeal the decision to award fees.

Richard Williams, 1 Abbott Avenue, asked if anything has transpired since the last meeting based on concerns raised then. Mr. Gadaleta stated that the ordinance creates a job title and salary range. The job description is not adopted by ordinance and remains a fluid document. Mr. Gadaleta stated that the job description has changed since the last meeting.

Barbara Burns, 4 Ocean Avenue, stated there was discussion about whether this person can approve Certificates of Appropriateness because the Land Use Ordinance does not provide for administrative approval. Mr. Gadaleta stated that the job description must be in compliance with Land Use Law and Township ordinance.

There being no further comments, the Deputy Mayor closed the public hearing.

The ordinance was adopted on the following vote: Brantley, aye; Lane, aye; and Rizzo, aye.

Barbara Burns, 4 Ocean Avenue, asked for the process to obtain a handicapped stall. Mr. Cuttrell stated that there is an application. The person must be a resident and have a handicapped parking tag issued by the state. The Police Department then verifies the information.

Ann Horan, 69 Clark, stated that some people with a handicapped parking stall are not residents and some may be using handicapped tags that have been issued to someone else.

There being no further comments, the Deputy Mayor closed the public hearing.

AUTHORIZE AN AMENDMENT TO THE 2018 MUNICIPAL BUDGET TO REALIZE MONIES FROM THE DIVISION OF HIGHWAY TRAFFIC SAFETY

WHEREAS, N.J.S. 40A:4-87 provides that the Director of the Division of Local Government Services may approve the insertion of any special item of revenue in the budget of any county or municipality when such item shall have been made available by law and the amount thereof was not determined at the time of the adoption of the budget; and,

WHEREAS, said Director may also approve the insertion of an item of appropriation for an equal amount; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Township Committee of the Township of Neptune hereby requests the Director of the Division of Local Government Services to approve the insertion of an item of revenue in the budget for the year 2018 in the sum of \$6,500.00 which is now available from a NJDL&PS Division of Highway Traffic Safety Grant in the amount of \$6,500.00; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the like sum of \$6,500.00 is hereby appropriated under the caption of 2019 Pedestrian Safety Enforcement; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the above is the result of funds from the New Jersey Department of Law & Public Safety – Division of Highway Traffic Safety Pedestrian Safety Education and Enforcement Fund in the amount of \$6,500.00; and,

AUTHORIZE THE EXECUTION OF A RECIPROCAL MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT WITH THE BOROUGH OF BELMAR FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES

WHEREAS, the Township of Neptune desires to enter into a reciprocal Mutual Aid Agreement between Neptune Township Emergency Medical Services and Belmar Emergency Medical Services; and,

WHEREAS, mutual aid assistance agreements between municipalities for police, fire and emergency medical services are permitted pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:14-26; and,

WHEREAS, it is deemed to be in the best interest of the residents of the Township of Neptune to enter into a reciprocal mutual aid and assistance agreement with the Borough of Belmar to provide emergency medical services in the event of a large incident requiring additional resources or if the resources in the respective jurisdiction are unavailable; and,

WHEREAS, this Mutual Aid Agreement may be renewed on an annual basis and shall remain in effect for an unlimited timeframe unless cancelled by either entity in accordance with the notification requirements contained in the Agreement,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Township Committee of the Township of Neptune hereby authorizes the execution of a reciprocal Mutual Aid Agreement with the Borough of Belmar, a copy of which is on file in the Office of the Municipal Clerk, for emergency medical services; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this resolution be forwarded to the EMS Manager and the Borough of Belmar.

ACCEPT A MAINTENANCE GUARANTEE AND RELEASE A PERFORMANCE BOND FILED BY HERITAGE AT NEPTUNE, LLC FOR SITE IMPROVEMENTS AT WALNUT GROVE SUBDIVISION (INGLES COURT)

WHEREAS, on August 22, 2016, the Township Committee adopted a resolution which accepted performance bond 38533 in the amount of \$177,067.73 filed by Heritage at Neptune, LLC written by The Service Insurance Company guaranteeing site improvements at the Walnut Grove

subdivision, Ingles Court (former Block 3032, Lots 66, 74 & 75); and,

WHEREAS, on November 9, 2017, a reduction in said bond to the amount of \$53,120.32 was approved by Resolution #17-432; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Engineer has certified that all site improvements have been completed in a satisfactory manner as of June 21, 2018 and said performance bond can be released contingent upon posting a two year maintenance bond in the amount of \$44,760.00; and,

WHEREAS, Heritage at Neptune, LLC has posted Maintenance Bond #43742 in the amount of \$44,760.00, written by The Service Insurance Company, Inc. guaranteeing said site improvements for a period of two years,

AUTHORIZE RELEASE OF PERFORMANCE BOND AND AUTHORIZING QUOTES FOR A CONTRACT WITH A LANDSCAPER TO COMPLETE SOIL STABILIZATION AT 2108 WEST LAKE AVENUE, NEPTUNE TOWNSHIP, NEW JERSEY (BLOCK 909, LOT 7.01)

WHEREAS, a contractor known as Northeast Home Construction, located at 528 Arnold Avenue, Suite B, Point Pleasant Beach, New Jersey 08742, was performing construction work at 2108 West Lake Avenue in 2016 and 2017; and

WHEREAS, the Engineering Department of Neptune Township performed an inspection of the property and found that the yard of the property needed to be stabilized, and there were visible areas of erosion, in which case the same was submitted to the contractor by letter dated February 13, 20107 from Sean Areia, PE, CME, Assistant Township Engineer, requiring stabilization to occur, or the posting of a bond in the amount of \$1,800.00 to cover the future stabilization and landscaping of the area; and

WHEREAS, the contractor posted the bond for \$1,800.00, but has failed and refused after numerous requests to return to the worksite and complete the stabilization and the landscaping required; and

WHEREAS, the Township Attorney, by letter of July 6, 2018 to the contractor required the contractor to perform the work necessary within five (5) days of receipt of the aforesaid letter mailed by Certified Mail/RRR and regular mail, or the Township would seek authorization from the Township Committee for the release of the aforesaid bond and to seek quotes for a contractor to perform the work with payment from the aforesaid Performance Bond; and

WHEREAS, the Engineering Department and the Township Attorney are requesting authorization for said quotes and release of the aforesaid funds to seek a landscaper or contractor to complete the work since the original contractor, Northeast Home Construction, did not act accordingly within the five (5) day time period; and

WHEREAS, Northeast Home Construction responded on July 9, 2018 that it was not going to act upon the Township's request,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Township Committee of the Township of Neptune hereby authorizes release of the Performance Bond of \$1,800.00; due to the fact that the contractor, Northeast Home Construction, refused to act in accordance with the terms of the Performance Bond and the contract and within five days of receipt of the Township Attorney's letter of July 6, 2018 and Northeast Home Construction's reply of July 9, 2018, and further authorizes the Engineering Department or other appropriate agency of the Township to seek quotes from contractors to complete the work based on the \$1,800.00 Performance Bond amount; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Township Attorney, Township Engineer, and Assistant C.F.O.

AUTHORIZE THE SUBMISSION OF A TITLE IIIB FUNDING GRANT TO THE MONMOUTH COUNTY OFFICE ON AGING

WHEREAS, the Township of Neptune is desirous to obtain Title IIIB funding under the Older Americans Act for the three year cycle 2019-2021, in the amount of \$25,000 each year, from the Monmouth County Office on Aging to provide services to Neptune Seniors through the Neptune Senior Center; and,

WHEREAS, the Senior Center Director has completed the necessary documentation for submission,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Township Committee of the Township of Neptune hereby authorizes the submission of a grant request to the Monmouth County Office on Aging for Title IIIB funding for the three year cycle 2019-2021; and,

SUPPORT A LEFT TURN PROHIBITION FROM WESTBOUND ROUTE 33 TO STANLEY AVENUE AS RECOMMENDED BY THE NEW JERSEY DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) recently completed a traffic investigation and is performing roadway improvements along Route NJ 33 (Corlies Avenue) in the vicinity of Jersey Shore University Medical Center; and,

WHEREAS, a traffic island has recently been added on Stanley Avenue near the intersection with Route NJ 33 which prohibits left turns from westbound Route NJ 33 to Stanley Avenue; and,

WHEREAS, the NJDOT traffic investigation determined that this Left Turn prohibition appears warranted and can be recommended for approval,

WHEREAS, Labor Counsel has advised the governing body that although there is a legal fee shifting requirement in the case of OPRA, that there is no such fee shifting requirement under the Common Law, and that the Plaintiff is not entitled to legal fees in the instant matter; and

WHEREAS, Neptune Township is in the process of filing a Motion for Reconsideration with regard to the assessment of legal fees, but needs authorization if unsuccessful, and chooses to file a Notice of Appeal, if appropriate to the Appellate Division to address this case of first impression in involving legal fees under the Common Law.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR/PUBLIC COMMENTS

Tujain Berry, 1312 Monroe Avenue, stated that she received parking tickets for parking on Monroe Avenue. She has no driveway to park her car and wants to park in front of her house. She asked for the reason for this area being a no parking zone. Mr. Gadaleta will follow-up.

Rev. Edmund Lee, Patricia Drive, thanked the Mayor, Deputy Chief Fisher, Officer Brian Taylor and Mr. Lane for attending the Youth Violence Awareness event and for funding the cost of the food. He stated that a speed table is needed on Sunnyfield Terrace. He surveyed the neighbors and they are in favor of installing a speed table. Lt. Michael Zarro will follow-up.

Deborah Gray, 1102 Green Grove Road, stated that the vacant former Continental Insurance building is becoming a dumping ground and a safety hazard. People are going inside and there is drag racing in the parking lot. She asked that the lot be secured. Dr. Brantley stated that he is aware of the situation and that there is interest in purchasing the property. Mr. Gadaleta stated various departments are there regularly to assess the situation. He will see what can be done to limit vehicular access.

Pam Reinhardt, 107 Franklin Avenue, spoke in support of the upcoming HPAE union picketing that will take place in front of the hospital on August 15th. Their contract expired on July 31st and the union is seeking safe staffing levels. She explained that some departments in the hospital do not have state mandated staffing regulations. The union is also in support of increasing levels of support staff such as housekeeping.

Hank Coakley, Valley Road, stated that he wanted to thank the Mayor for the check from the Mayor's Ball to the American Legion. The funds helped to rebuild after recent flooding. He said the detour signs for the upcoming one day bridge closure are insufficient. He added that Route 33 was flooded due to mesh put over the storm drains because of on-going work. The mesh should be removed when there is heavy rain.

Jack Bredin, 94 ½ Heck Avenue, stated there was a recent Coaster article about the Homeowners Association meeting. Michael Badger, OGCMA President, says paring is available for the homes and the hotel at the North End. The Planning Board determined the boardwalk and Lake Avenue are streets. The pavilion is not on a street and should not be permitted to exist. He added that any parking violations given to delivery trucks at the North End should be given to the Township Committee because they have allowed the pavilion to exist when they should not have.

Ann Horan, 69 Clark Avenue, stated that she received her tax bill and it is up \$4,000. She read an article from 2014 regarding the Assessment Demonstration Program and that many towns were opting out. Ms. Rizzo stated that the towns have opted back in because all towns are now mandated that assessed value to be within 95% of real value.

Dorothy Argyros, 2100 Rutherford Avenue, stated that this is the two year anniversary of the death of Katie Lee Thomas and no report from the County has been received. She urged the Committee to file a complaint with the Attorney General regarding the County Prosecutor.

Dianna Harris, 17 Willow Drive, thanked the Mayor's Youth Council for coming out to the community garden to weed and mulch. She thanked the police officers at the Music in the Park events and suggested that SLEO II officers also have cards to hand out. She asked for a garbage can at the corner where the convenience store is located. She asked for an update on redevelopment. Dr. Brantley stated that the Committee is in negotiations and are asking any potential redevelopers to do the initiatives that the community has set forth. Ms. Harris stated that she wants hiring of local laborers.

James Brubaker, 91 Mt. Hermon Way, received a handout distributed to the Committee regarding the benefit of short term rentals. He recommended a \$1 per night fee for short term rentals to be placed in a Housing Improvement Fund.

Nancy Clarke, 47 Embury Avenue, stated that the RFP for Historic Architect will be going out shortly. She asked the HPC Chairperson be involved in the process. Mr. Gadaleta confirmed that she will be. Ms. Clarke asked Dr. Brantley if he is speaking to redevelopers for the all the redevelopment areas. Dr. Brantley stated that the Redevelopment Committee is speaking with developers regarding all of the zones. Ms. Clarke asked that during the Comments from the Dais portion of the meeting that the Committee members give reports on their respective departments that they oversee.

Dr. Brantley offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Lane to adjourn. All were in favor.
