THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by Township Committee of the Township of Neptune, that the governing body shall continue to maintain through the Engineering Department of Neptune Township, an Engineering Pool List of qualified engineers to be used for various engineering projects sponsored by Neptune Township, but in furtherance of the policy to avoid conflicts of interest, shall require any engineer on the Engineering Pool List who is selected for services to execute a Certification concerning conflict of interest certifying that the particular engineer/engineering firm, while providing services under any contract with Neptune Township for Neptune Township, shall not be representing private clients in Neptune Township at the same time, where such representation of private clients would require action or review by Neptune Township Municipal Officials, Agencies or Boards in fulfilling the engineer's obligations for a private client; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that should an engineer have a conflict, it shall not be selected by Neptune Township on a municipal project while the conflict exists, and should the conflict be discovered by Neptune Township and confirmed after an engineer on the Engineering Pool List certifies that no conflict exists, then that engineer/firm shall be removed from the Engineering Pool List, and not be returned to the Engineering Pool List for a period of at least three years, with further certification of lack of conflict of interest at the time of future placement on the Engineering Pool List; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Municipal Engineer shall provide a monthly report to the governing body as to the selection of engineers for services by the Municipal Engineering Department, and the basis for such selection from the Engineering Pool List.

## **ESTABLISH CASH MANAGEMENT PLAN**

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 8, Laws of 1982, The Township of Neptune is required to adopt a Cash Management Plan, including the Designation of a Depository or Depositories,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Committee of The Township of Neptune, a municipal Corporation of the County of Monmouth, in the State of New Jersey, that the Cash Management Plan dated January 1, 2018, and on file in the offices of the Municipal Clerk and Chief Financial Officer shall be adopted for the year 2018; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Chief Financial Officer and Auditor.

The resolutions of the Consent Agenda were adopted on the following vote: Brantley, aye; Lane, aye; McMillan, aye; Rizzo, aye; and Williams, aye.

Diana Harris, 17 Willow Drive, congratulated the new Mayor and Committee. She asked the Committee to reach out to MURC whenever needed. She thanked Dr. Brantley for his service in 2017 and his work on the West Lake Avenue streetscape. She thanked the Committee for the formation of the Police Committee and asked that a female resident be considered for appointment. She asked that the Committee continue to work on redevelopment on West Lake Avenue and to consider changed the Redevelopment Plan.

Jason Jones, Board of Education member, thanked the Committee for the cooperation with the Board to ensure the safety of our children. He is looking forward to partnering more with the Committee.

# COMMENTS FROM THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE

Mr. Brantley congratulated Mayor Williams and the Committee for showing great leadership. He looked forward to the future with them.

Mr. McMillan thanked Mr. Brantley for his service as Mayor. As the Police Commissioner the Police Department had its lowest crime rate in 30 years, He thanked Mr. Bascom for getting the Township through the accreditation process and they were also able to generate a revenue stream through EMS. The Township also had another historic event by appointing Larry Fisher as our first African American Deputy Chief. He went on to stated that as we go into 2018 they looked forward to expanding their economic development as it relates to the Township of Neptune. They also wanted to enhance their human relations component as it relates to reaching out to the community and reconnecting to the churches at large and expand our youth employment program that we have for our youth that work in Public Works during the summer time and our summer interns that come home from college. He stated he planned on working with Deputy Mayor Rizzo as it relates to stem opportunities. He congratulated Mayor Williams on his honor of being Mayor.

Mr. Lane read the following prepared statement:

I also want to recognize the incoming mayor for 2018 Committeeman Nick Williams and the Deputy Mayor, my running mate, Carol Rizzo.

I want to welcome all of you coming out today. I want to recognize my wife who could not be here today because she had to work and I could not do any of this without her by my side.

I would like to start off by saying, I have been on the Committee for a little over a year now and in that time I learned a lot from my fellow Committee members. 2017 was a great year, but we can always do better for everyone. I already met with all of my department heads that I oversee.

I am always looking for a way we can improve. Some of my ideas for 2018 are to try to expand the hours of the Senior Center to have one late night during the week and be open on a possible Saturday once a month because many seniors still are working while the senior center is open. I am also looking to find and recognize the oldest living Neptune resident who has never left Neptune. We are always looking to expand shared services, it is not always about the money but it is about bring other towns together. I am trying to get Neptune City involved with our Hooked on Fishing, Not on Drugs event. I am looking to do a pilot program to improve awareness of what is going on in the town by utilizing Neptune High School students y having them live stream the meetings. In closing, I want to stress our highest priority is to provide the highest quality of services while keeping the cost down and keeping residents safe. I want to wish everyone a happy and healthy New Year.

Ms. Rizzo thanked everyone from the Neptune Community and stated it was an honor to serve them and they try to be better in what they do. She stated Neptune had a great Police Department. She stated they are building on what they've had before. She recognized both Mr. Houghtaling and Mr. Bishop. She stated it was not new being a new member of the Committee and it takes a great deal of communication and she thanked the Committee for working with her. She also thanked the volunteers who volunteered their service. She thanked her daughter and partner

for supporting her. She stated they were going to make the stem program a real reality and Meridian has been a great partner for us

## MAYOR'S ADDRESS

Mayor Williams recognized the dignitaries in the room and read the following prepared statement:

Today as I stand here and address you, I am little nervous but extremely optimistic and determined for the upcoming year. I am proud of what this Committee has accomplished over the past two years serving under both Mayors Kevin McMillan and my running mate Dr. Michael Brantley. In the near future we will be looking to start building our ultra-modern skate board park in Sunshine Village. Along with the soccer fields, basketball courts, playground and running track, this will be an exciting addition for those who participated in skate boarding by using other municipalities facilities.

We will continue to work with the Neptune Board of Education in a coordinated effort to find added recreation opportunities for both our adults and especially our young residents of Neptune Township.

To the residents of Neptune Township, I have always believed if you think big then big things can happen. This governing body dreams big and we will continue to think that way. Yes, Neptune Township faces challenges just like any other place in the United States, but I've always kept n my mind, that tomorrow will be better than today and only we, together, can make it happen. But to you the community, I say "we cannot do it along." We need your help and your voice. I am asking each of you here today to accept my challenge: Engage and then Engage some more.

As you leave Town Hall today, I need each of you to accept the challenge. I

Engage in your neighborhoods and make it a place you want to live.

Engage in your Church Congregation and Organizations and bring forward your ideas together in making Neptune a better place for all in the future Engage in your family and children. Instill in them a confidence that they can have Bright future by working hard and becoming successful Most importantly, engage in yourself

In closing, I would like to say you have elected us and with the understanding you have put all our futures in our hands. Never shy away from sharing your ideas for a more vibrant Neptune with my fellow Committee members and I. We stand ready with open ears and open minds in saying "we all want Neptune to be a place we can be proud to call our Home. May God bless each of you here today and all residents of our great Township. I wish a Very Happy New Year to all of you and your families and I look forward to serving you as this year's Mayor. Thank you!
