### TOWNSHIP OF NEPTUNE ORDINANCE NO. 22-51

# AN ORDINANCE TO FURTHER AMEND AND SUPPLEMENT THE LAND DEVELOPMENT ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NEPTUNE BY DEFINING AND REGULATING CANNABIS CLASS USES

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Neptune that the Land Development Ordinance be and is hereby amended as follows:

#### **SECTION 1.**

### Section 415.21 – CANNABIS CLASS USES – is hereby added as follows:

Cannabis Class uses, (other than Alternative Treatment Centers) shall be permitted in the C-1 Zoning District provided the following supplementary regulations are met:

- A <u>Hours of Operation</u>. <u>Cannabis Class 5</u> uses are permitted the following hours of operation:
  - 1 **Sunday** thru Saturday: 9 AM to 10 PM;
  - 2 Sunday: Closed
- B <u>Location</u>. The permitted location of such uses shall be in accordance with the current NJ State requirements in addition to the following:
  - 1 Located within the C-1 and LI Zoning Districts;
  - 2 Class 5 Cannabis Retailer must be located a minimum 1,000 feet radius from furthest parcel lot line measurement of a school or daycare.
- C <u>Permitted Classes of Licenses (as defined by the State of NJ)</u>. The following classes or combination of are permitted:
  - 1 Class 1 Cannabis Cultivator
  - 2 Class 2 Cannabis Manufacturer
  - 3 Class 3 Cannabis Wholesaler
  - 4 Class 4 Cannabis Distributor
  - 5 Class 5 Cannabis Retailer
  - 6 Class 6 Cannabis Delivery Service
- D Quantity. The maximum permitted number of Class 5- Cannabis Retailer licenses in Neptune Township will be three (3). There is no limit on the number of licenses issued by the Township Committee for Class 1- Cannabis Cultivator, Class 2- Cannabis Manufacturer, Class 3- Cannabis Wholesaler, Class 4- Cannabis Distributor, and Class 6- Cannabis Delivery Service.

- E <u>Penalties</u>. Refer to Land Development Ordinance section 1105.
- F <u>Cannabis Consumption Areas</u>. Cannabis Consumption Areas are prohibited.
- G Performance Standards for All Cannabis Class Uses. Performance standards of Land Development Ordinance section 402 shall also apply.
  - Pollen And Seed Control. The cannabis business licensee shall implement measures to prevent cross-pollination and to prevent cannabis pollen and seeds from leaving the premises, including, but not limited to, use of pollen screens, ultraviolet light and methods to ensure that employees and other visitors do not leave the premises while carrying any cannabis pollen or seeds
  - Odor. A cannabis business licensee shall prevent all odors generated from the cultivation and storage of cannabis from escaping from the buildings on the site, such that the odor cannot be detected by a reasonable person of normal sensitivity outside the buildings. All cannabis facilities shall have an air treatment system to mitigate cannabis-related odor. The air treatment system shall have sufficient odor absorbing filtration systems utilizing carbon filters or similar, and ventilation and exhaust systems to eliminate cannabis odors coming from the interior of the premises, such that any odor generated inside the facility is not detectable by a person of reasonable sensitivity at the subject property line,

### 3 <u>Lighting.</u>

- (i) Interior building lighting will likely extend beyond sunset and light trespass at night should be prevented through the use of blackout shades with side tracking or other comparable technologies, activated dusk to dawn.
- (ii) Exterior building lighting shall comply with Township Ordinances.
- H Cannabis Cultivator & Cannabis Manufacturer Class Uses
  - 1 <u>Water Use.</u> In addition to the meeting all other Township requirements, the Applicant shall provide a water conservation plan, which describes all water sources and their reuse, with zero waste.

#### SECTION 2.

**Section 404.04 – C-1 – Planned Commercial Development**, is hereby amended to add the Cannabis Class Use(s) as a Conditional Use.

#### **SECTION 3.**

**Section 404.11 – LI – Light Industrial**, is hereby amended to add the Cannabis Class Use(s) as a Conditional Us.

### **SECTION 4.**

The remainder of all other sections and subsections of the aforementioned ordinance not specifically amended by this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

### SECTION 5.

All other Ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed as to such inconsistency.

### SECTION 6.

If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision so adjudged and the remainder of this Ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

### SECTION 7.

This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and publication according to law.

# RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER AND OTHER TOWNSHIP OFFICIALS TO UNDERTAKE CERTAIN ACTIONS IN CONNECTION WITH THE ISSUANCE OF A NOT TO EXCEED \$866,466 GENERAL IMPROVEMENT BOND ANTICIPATION NOTE

WHEREAS, the Township of Neptune, in the County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey (the "Township") is seeking to issue a not to exceed \$866,466 aggregate principal amount General Improvement Bond Anticipation Note (the "Note") to currently refund (i) a \$105,466 principal portion of a \$2,464,197 Bond Anticipation Note of the Township issued on December 30, 2021 and maturing on December 29, 2022 (the "December Prior Note"), which December Prior Note was originally issued in the aggregate principal amount of \$2,464,197 on December 30, 2021 to temporarily finance the costs of various general capital improvements in and for the Township (the remaining portion of such December Prior Note is being paid in the amount of (a) \$2,169,197 through the issuance of the Township's General Obligation Bonds, Series 2022, dated December 22, 2022 (the "Series 2022 Bonds"), to The Monmouth County Improvement Authority (the "Authority") and (b) \$189,534 through the application of the Reserve to Pay BANs in the Township's General Capital Fund), and (ii) a \$761,000 principal portion of a \$1,261,000 Bond Anticipation Note of the Township issued on July 7, 2022 and maturing on July 6, 2023 (the "July Prior Note" and together with the December Prior Note, the "Prior Notes"), which July Prior Note is subject to prepayment by the Township at any time prior to its stated maturity and was originally issued in the aggregate principal amount of \$1,402,000 on July 13, 2020 to temporarily finance the costs of various general capital improvements in and for the Township (the remaining portion of such July Prior Note is being paid (a) in the amount of \$460,000 through the issuance of the Township's Series 2022 Bonds to the Authority and (b) by a 2022 budgetary appropriation of the Township in the amount of \$40,000); and

WHEREAS, the Township desires to issue the Note to the Sewer Operating Fund of the Township; and

WHEREAS, such Note shall bear interest at a rate of zero and zero hundredths percentum (0.00%) per annum, shall be dated December 28 2022 and shall mature on December 27, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the Township seeks to authorize the issuance of the Note to the Sewer Operating Fund of the Township.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NEPTUNE, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF NEW JERSEY as follows:

Section 1. Pursuant to and in accordance with Bond Ordinance Number 18-06, Bond Ordinance Number 19-27, Bond Ordinance Number 19-28, Bond Ordinance Number 19-29, Bond Ordinance Number 19-38, Bond Ordinance Number 21-13, and Bond Ordinance Number 21-29, all duly adopted by the Township (collectively, the "General Improvement Bond Ordinances"), a General Improvement Bond Anticipation Note of the Township in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed

\$866,466 (the "Note") shall be issued for the purpose of currently refunding a portion of the July Prior Note and a portion of the December Prior Note.

Section 2. The Note is authorized to be issued to the Sewer Operating Fund of the Township.

Section 3. The Note shall be dated December 28, 2022 and shall mature on December 27, 2023, shall bear interest from its date, which interest shall be at a rate of zero and zero hundredths percentum (0.00%) per annum, and shall be in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A.

Section 4. The Note shall be subject to prepayment by the Township at any time prior to its stated date of maturity.

Section 5. The Note shall be executed by the Mayor and the Chief Financial Officer of the Township and the official seal shall be thereunto affixed and attested to by the Clerk of the Township. To the extent not otherwise determined by this resolution, it is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer of the Township the authority to determine all matters in connection with the Note issued, and the signature of the Chief Financial Officer upon the Note shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. The Chief Financial Officer is also hereby authorized to sell part or all of the Note from time to time at a public or private sale and to deliver it to the purchaser thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price and accrued interest thereon from its date to the date of delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to report in writing to the Township Committee at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the Note pursuant to this resolution is made. Such report must include the principal amount, the description, the interest rate, the maturity schedule of the Note so sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized and directed to deliver any certificates necessary in connection with the issuance of the Note.

WHEREAS, during the time period of the aforesaid initial lawsuit, Neptune Township changed JIFs and insurance carriers, and by Resolution approved on August 13, 2018, authorized the Township Attorney, Gene J. Anthony, Esq., to file a legal action known as Declaratory Judgment in the Superior Court of New Jersey; seeking a Court ruling and interpretation as to the appropriateness of the insurance carrier's denial, and that such action would include both JIFs and insurance carriers, including an excess insurance carrier that overlapped during the period of the Horan matter; and

WHEREAS, the underlying Horan matter was ultimately settled for \$150,000.00, and so authorized by the governing body on November 8, 2018 by Resolution; and

WHEREAS, the original Declaratory Judgment matter that was filed in the Superior Court, Law Division, Monmouth County under Docket No. MON-L-3398-18 included the Garden State Municipal Joint Insurance Fund, Underwriters at Lloyd's, 100% Brit Syndicates, Ltd., Syndicate 2987; Statewide Insurance Fund; National Casualty Company; Nationwide Insurance Company, Evanston Insurance Company (later to be voluntarily dismissed from said lawsuit), and have been subject to outstanding Motions and Cross-motions for Summary Judgment.
