REPORT OF THE BUSINESS ADMINISTRATOR

The Business Administrator will report on capital projects and matters of general interest.

- Living Shoreline Project: The Army Corps of Engineers has initiated the necessary public notice that we have been discussing for the past two months. Our engineering office has contacted the design engineer to assure that we can be ready to go to bid for this project as soon as we receive the permitting. We continue to be optimistic that the project will be completed this coming fall in accordance with the grant requirements.
- Myrtle Avenue Reconstruction: It is anticipated that this project will begin next week. This is a NJDOT TTF funded project. NJAW Company has notified us that they would like to replace their water main and associated infrastructure in as part of our project. We will be meeting with them to discuss the integration. As a result, final paving for this project will likely not occur until mid-August.
- Various Capital (Concrete) Projects: The work at the Veteran's Memorial at Broadway and Route 71 will be
 completed prior to Memorial Day. Once that work is completed, the contractor will move on to the next
 phases of the project which will include the first aid squad aprons and the front stairs of the municipal
 complex.
- Capital Improvement Plan: Secondary administrative review of submitted capital projects are underway. It is
 expected that recommendations for funding ordinances will be made to the governing body at the second
 meeting of May.
- Welsh Farms Property: The Township received a grant in the amount of \$321,573.75 to complete site remediation on this site.
