## ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING GRANT OF DEED OF OPEN SPACE EASEMENT TO THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH ON BLOCK 1807, LOT 2 (FORMERLY KNOWN AS BLOCK 307.26, LOT 5) OWNED BY THE TOWNSHIP OF NEPTUNE

WHEREAS, the Township of Neptune has made improvements to property used for a public park, recreation and open space uses, located at Block 1807, Lot 2 (Formerly known as Block 307.26, Lot 5) and owned by the Township of Neptune; and

WHEREAS, the Township has received \$250,000.00 for development of said park, known as Sunshine Village Park, Phase II of the Skatepark, with the condition that the Township grant the County a Deed of Open Space Easement, which guarantees forever that the property be maintained for public park, recreation and open space uses, and prevents any use of the property that will significantly impair or interfere with the park, recreation and open space values of the property.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Neptune of the County of Monmouth in the State of New Jersey, that pursuant to State Statute allowing municipalities to accept a grant for an Open Space Easement, the governing body hereby authorizes the Mayor and Municipal Clerk to execute the Deed of Open Space Easement, and hereby grants a Deed of Open Space Easement to Monmouth County with regard to property located at Block 1807, Lot 2 (Formerly Block 307.26, Lot 5) on the Tax Map of the Township of Neptune granted at the time of development and improvement of said property, and that this Open Space Easement shall be granted to Monmouth County pursuant to the Deed of Open Space Easement attached hereto as Exhibit A.

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances which are inconsistent herewith are repealed, but only to the extent of such inconsistency.

This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its final passage and publication as required by law.

## RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NEPTUNE APPROVING VICTORY NATURAL FARMS LLC FOR A CANNABIS BUSINESS LICENSE TO OPERATE AS RECREATIONAL USE CANNABIS ESTABLISHMENT WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF NEPTUNE

**WHEREAS,** in 2020 New Jersey voters approved Public Question 1, which amended the New Jersey Constitution to allow for the legalization of a controlled form of marijuana called "cannabis" for adults at least 21 years of age; and

**WHEREAS,** on February 22, 2021, Governor Murphy signed into law P.L. 2021, c. 16, known as the "New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory, Enforcement Assistance, and Marketplace Modernization Act," N.J.S.A. 24:61-31 et seq. (the "Act"), which legalizes the personal use of marijuana by adults 21 years of age or older, and establishes a comprehensive regulatory and licensing scheme for commercial personal use cannabis operations, use, and possession; and

**WHEREAS,** the Act establishes the following six marketplace classes of business licenses to be issued by the State of New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory Commission for the legal operation of cannabis establishments and other types of cannabis marketplace activity in the State: Class 1 Cannabis Cultivator; Class 2 Cannabis Manufacturer; Class 3 Cannabis Wholesaler; Class 4 Cannabis Distributor; Class 5 Cannabis Retailer; and Class 6 Cannabis Delivery; and

WHEREAS, section 31a of the Act, N.J.S.A. 24:6l-45a, authorizes municipalities to adopt ordinances and regulations prohibiting outright or limiting the number of any class of licensed "cannabis establishments" (defined in section 33 of the Act, N.J.S.A. 24-6l-33, as "a cannabis cultivator, a cannabis manufacturer, a cannabis wholesaler, or a cannabis retailer"), cannabis distributors, or cannabis delivery services allowed to operate within its municipal boundaries; and

**WHEREAS,** Victory Natural Farms LLC wishes to operate as both a medical and personal use cannabis establishment, and specifically as a Class 1 Cannabis Cultivator and Class 2 Cannabis Manufacturer within the Township of Neptune; and

**WHEREAS,** on February 28, 2022, the Neptune Township Committee passed Ordinance 22-10, which allows for Victory Natural Farms LLC to operate as both a medical and personal use cannabis establishment within the Township of Neptune, including specifically as a "Class 1 Cannabis Cultivator service:" and "Class 2 Cannabis Manufacturer service"; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Township Committee of the Township of Neptune, County of Monmouth, State of Jersey, as follows:

- 1. The aforesaid recitals are incorporated herein as if set forth at length;
- 2. Victory Natural Farms LLC is registered to do business in the State of New Jersey and is authorized to operate as a Cannabis Cultivator and a Cannabis Manufacturer by the CRC;
- 3. The Township of Neptune has specifically passed Ordinance 22-10, which allows Victory Natural Farms LLC to operate both as a medical and personal use cannabis establishment, and specifically as a "Class 1 Cannabis Cultivator service:" and "Class 2 Cannabis Manufacturer service" within the Township of Neptune's jurisdiction;

- 4. The issuance of a license to Victory Natural Farms LLC by the State to concurrently operate as both a medical and personal use cannabis establishment by the CRC will not exceed any limits placed on the number of licensed cannabis establishments permitted to operate within the municipality;
- 5. The Township of Neptune supports the application of Victory Natural Farms LLC and this Resolution may be relied upon by the CRC as proof of local support by the Township of Neptune of GDBS Distributors LLC certification.
- 6. The Township Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to provide a copy of this Resolution to GDBS Distributors LLC and to transmit a copy of this Resolution to the CRC; and
- 7. This Resolution shall take effect upon adoption in accordance with applicable law.

## AUTHORIZING SETTLEMENT IN THE PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY LAWSUIT AGAINST FORMER LABOR ATTORNEY, NITA RAVAL, ESQ. BY NEPTUNE TOWNSHIP

WHEREAS, former employee, Krista Horan, of the Municipal Library, was terminated, and after some negotiations between the then Township's Labor Attorney, Nita Raval, Esq., and Plaintiff's Attorney, a lawsuit was brought in the Superior Court of New Jersey, Monmouth County, under Docket No. MON-L-00306-18; claiming wrongful termination; and

WHEREAS, the matter was referred to the insurance carrier, National Casualty, under Policy No. PKONJA0025, but was denied coverage in the instant matter based on the proposition that negotiations between the then Labor Attorney, Nita Raval, Esq. and the Plaintiff's attorney had occurred two years previously causing a claim, which should have been supplied to the insurance carrier, and that said claim was not filed in a timely fashion; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the aforesaid denial, a Declaratory Judgment action was filed by Neptune Township in the Superior Court of New Jersey on September 19, 2018 seeking a court ruling and interpretation as to the appropriateness of the insurance carrier's denial as well as other insurance carriers and two JIF's; and

WHEREAS, in addition to the Declaratory Judgment action, the Township decided through its subsequent Labor Attorney to authorize a lawsuit to be filed against former Labor Attorney, Nita Raval, Esq. by Resolution authorizing a legal malpractice lawsuit and legal representation by the law firm of Grace, Marmero and Associates against Nita Raval, Esq. on March 11, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the Krista Horan matter was settled by Resolution of November 8, 2018, and the Declaratory Judgment action was settled by Resolution of December 22, 2022, with the Township receiving \$6,000.00; and

WHEREAS, it is now the recommendation of the attorney representing the Township, James Grace, Esq., to settle the Nita Raval matter for receipt of \$15,000.00 with mutual releases for all parties.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Township Committee of the Township of Neptune, County of Monmouth and State of New Jersey, that the governing body hereby authorizes a Stipulation of Settlement and Dismissal with Prejudice to be filed with the Court upon execution and mutual releases being provided, which shall settle the legal malpractice case against Nita Raval, Esq. for a total of \$15,000.00 with said mutual releases releasing all claims filed by all parties in this matter.
