ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION IN OPEN SESSION

1. 2024 Capital Requests and recommendations

Mr. Stroud stated he had a few concerns that he raised and had received clarification on the points of concern on the recommendation.

2. Time Keeping Policy

Mr. Cohen stated that since he has been appointed as Labor Counsel since January and he did not bring up the time keeping policy. It was brought to Mr. Cohen's attention that there is a time keeping policy, but department heads are not required to or are not following a policy. After speaking with Mr. Anthony, there was a discussion about the time keeping policy and developed a policy for the Township Committee. Mr. Cohen stated there was concern expressed about the policy from department heads. Mr. Cohen stated some of the issues raised were regarding special events and Mr. Cohen stated it is not, because department heads are not required to attend events per their contract so it would be on their own time. Mr. Cohen addressed concerns raised by the Chief of Police where he requested a similar policy that offers a directive to the Chief of Police to handle issues.

Mr. Stroud stated he does not have an issue with the time keeping policy even for salaried employees. Mr. Stroud stated he believed that a standard process would be beneficial but understands the exemption to the police department.

Mr. Cafferty asked that the Township Committee does not consider this resolution or policy tonight. Mr. Cafferty stated he is understanding of a need for accountability, but it is not such a pressing matter that it needs to be solved tonight.

Mr. Lane stated he agreed with Mr. Cafferty. Mr. Lane stated he understands accountability but believes the policy may seem like the Committee is not trusting of the staff. Mr. Lane asked what the HR Director thinks of the proposed policy.

Mr. Cohen stated the process to clock is not onerous and would address some issues that are of concern for HR.

Mr. Cafferty stated there are other expectations of department heads. Many of the department heads are here late to complete items or wrap things up. Mr. Cafferty did not want to see punitive actions taken against employees who may be late. Mr. Cohen stated the policy states that department heads will be required to punch in and punch out and would not be subject to penalty for those reasons, but if the employee is looking for a change to the schedule, they must request such an accommodation from the Township Committee.

Mr. Stroud stated he just wanted to have a policy to encourage accountability. He does not want the

policy to be used as a punishment.

Mayor York stated she is in agreement with Mr. Cafferty and added that the policy encourages safety because it shows where employees are. Mayor York is in support of the adoption of the time keeping policy.

Mr. Lane addressed concerns that a policy of this nature may be viewed as disrespectful to the employees. Mayor York stated this is not a disrespectful choice, it is just a safety issue.

Mr. Cohen stated the policy may benefit department heads during litigation to help prove whereabouts and access.

Mr. Cafferty stated there has been a workshop discussion and at the next meeting.

Mr. Stroud asked if there is a timeclock at each satellite office, Ms. Siboni stated there is not at the marina. Mr. Cohen stated there is a POSS System that may offer remote punch in.

The public will be permitted one visit to the microphone with a limit of five minutes. Name and Address Comment Joan Venezia Ms. Venezia asked about charging stations at the Old Neptune High School and there was a rumor that the Township installed them and did not get permission from Mt. Hermon Way the High School. There were also two charging stations that were approved by grant and that it would be in front of the emporium. Ms. Venezia asked for an update on 63 Cookman Ave. Ms. Venezia asked for an update on dogs on the beach. Ms. Venezia asked if the police may be called to remove the dog. Ms. Venezia stated she would like the Township Committee members on the planning board know that she is against the size of the building and has concerns about their emergency plans,

sprinkler systems and fire issues that are posed by the Ocean Grove North End

Redevelopment.

Mr. Anthony stated the Township entered a revocable license agreement with the Camp Meeting association, but the Jersey Shore Arts Center states they own the parking lot, not the Camp Meeting issue. There is a title issue on the property and neither entity wishes to enter the Revocable License Agreement.

Mr. Anthony stated that 63 Cookman was scheduled at court last Thursday, but that was cancelled by the Judge due to a calendar conflict. Mr. Anthony stated he is waiting on a new court date but has been discussions with the attorney on the property to address the issues.

Eileen Michaels Seaview Ave. Ms. Michaels expressed concern about people leaving La Pierre are driving down the street the wrong way. Ms. Michaels requested that someone look into this to see if signage or enforcement can occur.

Ms. Michaels asked for assistance to reach out to the members of the Board of Education to partner with them to have a school supply drive.

Ms. Michaels asked if the agenda can be released earlier than Friday night before the meeting.

Ms. Michaels expressed concern about the Ocean Grove North End Redevelopment will have on traffic safety on her street.

Mr. Cafferty described the process of agenda preparation and explained why the agenda is released when it is.

Paul Kaplan Mt. Zion Way Mr. Kaplan stated the Chief of Police indicated that the Bike Control would be out this year. Mr. Kaplan asked if there is any information of the schedule, the enforcement returns, etc. Mr. Stroud stated he has seen the bike patrols in Ocean Grove and Bradley Park but has received good feedback from residents on the matter.

Rich Robinson Hillside Dr. Mr. Robinson asked why the animal house ordinance is not on the agenda. Ms. York stated it is scheduled for the July 8 meeting. Mr. Robinson stated the 4th of July is upcoming and will occur before the next meeting and Mr. Robinson wants to know when an ordinance will be on the books. Mr. Robinson asked if a mercantile registration could be revoked. Mr. Anthony sought a response from Deputy Tax Collector Michele Narciso who was in attendance to the meeting. Ms. Narciso noted it was a registration and it does not have ability for revocation. Mr. Robinson asked about the possibility of an ordinance that addresses the different sections of the Town specifically the difference between Ocean Grove and the remaining parts of Neptune Township.

Robert Ingato Seaview Ave. Mr. Ingato asked for an update on the grant for the Wesley Lake footbridges. Mr. Cafferty stated the submission for the grant was for both bridges but will follow up for a status.

Amy Heller Mt. Tabor Way Ms. Heller asked why the animal house ordinance does not apply to all residents and rentals instead of only short-term rentals. Mr. Anthony stated there was not a discussion about animal house applying to anything other than short term rentals. Ms. Heller stated at the last meeting the ordinance would be a separate ordinance for animal house and it was discussed that all properties be subject to the animal housing.

Mr. Stroud stated he was in favor of applying animal house to all property types. Ms. Heller addressed the Committee and asked them to consider applying animal house rules to all homes.

Ms. Heller stated there are traffic issues on New Jersey and Mt. Tabor. Ms. Heller asked for additional stop signs for a 4-way stop.

Gary Brown Cardinal Rd.

Mr. Brown stated he wished he would have seen or heard some of the cleanup efforts at the encampment. Mr. Brown stated there were notices that the occupants need to vacant the land. Mr. Brown stated he has seen new and more people living in the encampment. Mr. Brown asked when all those in the encampment are out, how will the Township ensure that the encampment does not restart and will there be a

long-term plan for property maintenance.

Joyce Klein Mt. Hermon Way Ms. Klein followed up on the comments by Ms. Heller. Ms. Klein is in support of an Animal House ordinance for short term rentals. Ms. Klein also agrees that the home Ms. Heller is speaking on is a problem home that is very disruptive. Ms. Klein believes she has reached out to the appropriate departments to address the matter, but it has not improved. Ms. Klein asked what other remedy or guidance that the Township can provide to address the concerns of long-term rentals.

Mr. Stroud suggested enforcement of the current ordinances. Mayor York suggested calling the department of child safety to perform a wellness check.

Barbara Burns Ocean Ave. Ms. Burns asked what the focus of the inspection for Certificate of Inspection for short term rentals. Ms. Burns summarized Mr. Anthony's response is the goal is safety. Ms. Burns asked why the difference of the inspection prices are different for Winter or Summer Rental. Ms. Burns suggested a change for fees associated with the Short-Term inspections and the removal of the short-term rental seasons included in the ordinance.

Mr. Cafferty stated there are requirements for Winter and Summer seasons which is why the seasons are separated. Ms. Burns stated she doesn't believe that justifies the two seasons inspection.

Dan Muller Hillside Dr. Mr. Muller stated the owners of 401 Overlook have a commercial mortgage that states the owner and family cannot live there, but the property owner has put in writing that they do live there. Mr. Anthony stated that issue is a private contracting issue and not a municipal issue.

Karen Mason Cardinal Rd. Ms. Mason stated the issue the Township keeps noting is "enforcement issues". Ms. Mason stated there has been a homeless encampment for almost a decade. Ms. Mason stated that the property owner has abused the neighborhood by not managing the issues of the property. Ms. Mason is frustrated that violations for tall grass are being issued when the property with the homeless encampment is ongoing.

Ann Bishop Franklin Ave. Ms. Bishop was glad to see the animal house ordinance was not on the agenda because the residents are here to speak more on the proposed ordinance. Ms. Bishop suggested the animal house ordinance be drafted and separate minimum stay and property management ordinance. Ms. Bishop stated there are not any for sure information about who is doing the excessive noise that garner so much conflict. Is it possible to look at data in September to seek a correlation between the real number of offenses and the information about the alleged offenders to determine if the problem is homeowners, 2-day renters, 3-day renters or longer rentals. Ms. Bishop stated a review of this information would render actual answers to whether such a change to an ordinance would be effective rather than basing the ordinance personal experience or beliefs.
