TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE MEETING - MARCH 23, 2020

(Due to pandemic, no workshop meeting was held and regular meeting started a 4:00 p.m.)

Mayor Lane called the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m. and requested the Clerk to call the roll. The following members were present: Dr. Michael Brantley (via phone), Kevin B. McMillan, Carol Rizzo (via phone), Nicholas Williams, and Mayor Robert Lane, Jr.

Also present at the dais were Richard J. Cuttrell, Municipal Clerk; Vito D. Gadaleta, Business Administrator; and Gene Anthony, Township Attorney.

After a moment of Silent Prayer and the Flag Salute, the Mayor asked the Clerk to indicate the fire exits.

The Clerk stated, "Fire exits are located in the rear of the room and to my right. In case of fire you will be notified by bell and or public address system, then proceed to the nearest smoke-free exit"

AUTHORIZE AMENDED CONSENT ORDER WITH EVELYN STUMPF, JOHN WHERLE, STUMPY'S SALES AND SERVICES; NEW DEFENDANTS, JMA HOLDINGS, LLC AND MICHAEL GRAUBART, INDIVIDUALLY, IN THE LAWSUIT BEFORE THE SUPERIOR COURT OF NEW JERSEY, CHANCERY DIVISION, MONMOUTH COUNTY, DOCKET NO. C-125-16

WHEREAS, Neptune Township, based on authorization by Resolution, brought a lawsuit in the Superior Court of New Jersey, Chancery Division, Equity Part of Monmouth County seeking Injunctive Relief against the original Defendants from continuing the use of their business property for any use other than preexisting, nonconforming uses, and seeking removal of an expanded nonconforming structure at the subject site, as well as other relief in 2016; and

WHEREAS, on October 3, 2018, the original parties entered into a Stipulation of Settlement and Dismissal with Prejudice, which required the original Defendants to take certain action before the Planning Board or Zoning Board of Adjustment within 90 days of entering into the Stipulation of Settlement and Dismissal; and

WHEREAS, as a result of violations of the Stipulation of Settlement and Dismissal by Defendants, Evelyn Stumpf, John Wherle and Stumpy's Sales and Services, the governing body authorized a Motion for Enforcement and a Consent Order of Enforcement of a Stipulation of Settlement and Dismissal dated October 2, 2019 by Resolution of October 10, 2019; which provided the original Defendants in this matter with an additional six (6) months to either comply with the original Stipulation of Settlement and Dismissal or sell the property to a new buyer, who would either comply with the same, or demolish the subject building or submit a new Site Plan Application before the appropriate Municipal Board; and

WHEREAS, the original Defendants did sell the subject property to JMA Holdings, LLC and Michael Graubart, who are willing to enter into an amended Consent Order, along with the original Defendants, concerning the use of the subject property as set forth more fully in the Amended Consent Order on file in the Office of the Municipal Clerk,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Township Committee of the Township of Neptune, County of Monmouth and State of New Jersey, hereby authorize the Township Attorney to execute the aforesaid Amended Consent Order of Enforcement of the Stipulation of Settlement and Dismissal with Prejudice of October 3, 2018, a copy of which is on file in the Office of the Municipal Clerk, providing for the settlement of all claims arising from the original lawsuit, and have the same recorded in the Clerk's Office of Monmouth County so that the obligations and commitments all of the Defendants in the Amended Consent Order shall run with the land.

Joan Venezia, 107 Mt. Hermon Way, asked if there a requirement for the Township Committee to conduct a certain number of meetings or if you have to meet within a required timeframe. Mr. Anthony responded that there is no set requirement on how frequently to hold meetings but the Committee must meet to adopt resolutions and other official action. Ms. Venezia asked if the April 27th meeting will be held via teleconference. Mr. Gadaleta stated that the Township is trying to expedite the necessary installation of cameras for teleconferencing. Ms. Venezia stated that the Planning Board resolution to approve the North End projects lists conditions for approval but does not contain reference to the Historic Preservation Commission (HPC). Mr. Gadaleta stated that the Planning Board memorialized the approval resolution so the process before the Planning Board is complete. The HPC approval is required along with all of the other listed conditions before construction permits are issued. Ms. Venezia asked for additional details on how a teleconferencing meeting would work. Mr. Gadaleta responded that those issues will be worked out prior to the April 27th meeting.

Dianna Harris, Willow Drive, stated that she heard the announcement regarding the release of prisoners from County jails. She asked if anyone knows how many of the released prisoners will be in Neptune. Mr. Gadaleta replied that this was just announced so the Township does not have any information on this matter. She asked if the World Changers initiative will still be held. Mr. Gadaleta replied that World Changers will still take place in July. He will look into extending the deadline for applications.

Mr. Gadaleta stated that in light of the state of emergency, there will be paid staffing at the fire departments and first aid squads that will remain for the duration of the health crisis.

Mayor Lane asked if the various job openings have been posted on the web site. Mr. Gadaleta stated that the listing are posted and he has heard that the hospital, Shop-Rite and Amazon are hiring. Ms. Rizzo added that the hospital has a lot of job openings and she is compiling a list.

Mr. Williams offered a motion, seconded by Ms. Rizzo to adjourn. All were in favor.
