### LOW INCOME HOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Applications are being accepted for the Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP). HEAP is designed to help low-income households and/or individuals, 60 years of age or older, meet their home heating and medically necessary cooling costs. The application period is October 1, 2022 to June 30, 2023. For further info, contact X:589. 
