Scope and Purpose

I, Kevin M. Craig, Assistant Vice President, Porzio Compliance Services have been retained to conduct an expert review of police response records related to College Achieve Public School (CAPS) Greater Asbury Park (GAP) in Neptune, New Jersey between January 1, 2021, and May 30, 2023.

CAPS-GAP Neptune currently serves kindergarten through grade eight students. The purpose of the engagement is to provide an expert review of the incidents to determine how reported incidents are related to the school and provide an expert opinion regarding the potential impact of an expansion of the school to include grades nine through twelve.

The report that follows is limited in scope and the review and resulting opinions are based only on the materials provided. Any additional documents, videos, or other materials that may be pertinent to this case but have not been made available for review are not considered in this report.

Conclusions made in this report are my opinions based on my knowledge, training, and experience in school safety and security and law enforcement in relation to the information provided and the scope of the requested review.

Expert Background and Qualifications

Kevin Craig is a recognized subject matter expert in law enforcement, management, and school security. A retired New Jersey Police Chief, he has over 30 years of experience in public safety, emergency management, and school security. He is a Licensed Private Detective and is certified as a Public Manager, Police Instructor, School Safety Specialist, Security Officer Instructor (SORA), and School Resource Officer in New Jersey. Chief Craig holds a Master's Degree in Public Administration with a specialization in School Security and Safety Administration. He has represented the NJ State Association of Chiefs of Police on the NJ K-12 Task Force in conjunction with the Office of Homeland Security and Preparedness, and was appointed to the

New Jersey School Security Task Force by the Governor of New Jersey as a subject matter expert.

In addition to being In addition to being awarded the designation of Certified Protection Professional through ASIS International, he is also a certified instructor in Active Shooter Response, De-escalation, and Threat Assessment, Chief Craig is an instructor for the NJ School Safety Specialist Academy in the NJ Department of Education, a member of the ASIS International School Safety and Security Community Steering Committee and Advisory Board Member and Master Instructor for the NJ Association of School Resource Officers. He is an Adjunct Professor at Fairleigh Dickinson University where he instructs courses in emergency management, threat assessment, and crisis communication.

After retiring from law enforcement in 2015, Chief Craig held the position of Director of Safety and Security for a public school district in New Jersey and also served as the Anti-bullying Specialist, School Safety Specialist, Attendance Officer, and Homeless Liaison among other roles. He received training in restorative practices and positive behavior interventions and supports (PBIS) and served as a mentor for students in the Intervention and Referral Services (I&RS) program.

Throughout his law enforcement career and beyond, Chief Craig has conducted training, planning and assessments for public and private schools, businesses, and faith based institutions. He is regularly consulted as a subject matter expert on issues pertaining to school security. A detailed resume/CV is provided illustrating additional training and experience. (Exhibit A)

Factual Summary

CAPS GAP Neptune currently serves kindergarten through grade eight students. The purpose of the engagement is to provide an expert review of the incidents to determine how reported incidents are related to the school and provide an expert opinion regarding the potential impact of an expansion of the school to include grades nine through twelve.

Documents provided by Neptune Police Department through an Open Public Records Act (OPRA) request revealed a total of one hundred and eighteen (118) calls for service or incidents to 3455 W., Bangs Ave. or the immediate vicinity. An analysis was conducted to determine the types of incidents and their relation to CAPS-GAP.

Document Review, Research & Investigation

The documents provided for review included the following:

- Police call list CAPS GAP Neptune- Neptune Police Department
- Police records provided under OPRA request- CAPS Neptune
- Police call list CAPS GAP High School- Asbury Park

Analysis and Commentary

The documents provided for review included a general list of police responses related to 3455 W. Bangs Avenue, Neptune, New Jersey. The list also includes incidents related to Holy Innocents Church which uses the same address, as well as multiple addresses on Randi Way, which is a residential street directly across from the school. The addresses on Randi Way are private residences unaffiliated with the school. In addition to the call list, detailed descriptions of some incidents were provided by Neptune Police, however some incidents that involved Emergency Medical Services responses and juvenile information were not released. In some cases, school officials provided context for some incidents where reports could not be released by police.

A review of the call list and related reports identified a total of one hundred and eighteen (118) total reported incidents between January 1, 2021, and May 30, 2023. Of the 118 incidents, twenty-nine (29) were determined to be unrelated to the school in any way. Forty-one (41) incidents were related to the school and in forty-eight (48) incidents the connection to the school could not be determined due to lack of available information.

The forty-one (41) incidents related to the school included the following categories:

Twelve (12) of the 41 incidents occurred after school hours.

The forty-eight (48) incidents with undetermined connections to the school included the following categories:

Fourteen (14) of the forty-eight (48) incidents occurred after school hours.

A police call list for CAPS-GAP High School was also provided. The call list for the high school located in Asbury Park indicated that there was a total of twenty (20) police response to the high school during the period of January 1, 2021, and July 12, 2023. The incidents were primarily limited to parking violations, noise complaints, and alarms. Ten (10) of the twenty (20) incidents at this location occurred after school hours.

Conclusions

Based upon a comprehensive review of documents and information provided, I offer the following conclusions:

1. Of the one hundred and eighteen (118) incidents reported during the period of January 1, 2021, and May 30, 2023, twenty-nine (29) were not connected to the school in any way.
2. Forty-eight (48) incidents lacked information to determine a direct connection to the school, however, the types and locations of some of the incidents such as vehicle

- accidents, vehicle stops, and reports related to addresses on Randi Way, are unlikely to have any direct connection to the school. Other call types such as alarms, assisting other agencies, harassment, and EMS calls, even if directly connected to the school are not high-volume occurrences and not indicative of a crime problem or a significant use of local emergency resources.
3. Forty-one (41) incidents were determined to be directly related to the school. The most significant number of incidents involved facility related issues such as gas and water leaks and a smoke condition. Once identified, these incidents were mitigated by the school. The facility issues are not related to student enrollment or grade levels. Other incidents such as students in crisis, child services interviews, threats, and staff and student need for EMS services are common occurrences in any school setting and not indicative of a crime problem or a significant use of local emergency resources. These incident types are also unrelated to enrollment or grade levels.
 4. The call list for CAPS-GAP High School in Asbury saw a significantly lower number of incidents (20) as compared to CAPS-GAP Neptune. This list of incidents was provided without context. Because the high school is in a different municipality, the numbers may not directly correlate to Neptune, however, the significantly lower call volume at this location is not indicative of a generally higher rate of incidents or needs for police or emergency resources based on grade levels or enrollment.

Summary

Based on my knowledge and expertise as a former police chief, school safety specialist, and recognized expert in law enforcement and school safety, I conclude that the types and frequency of incidents and responses that are directly related to CAPS-GAP Neptune are similar to those commonly seen in public and non-public K-12 school districts. Many of the incidents included in the call lists were unrelated to the school and those related to the school often involved facility or other issues common to schools regardless of enrollment or grade levels served.
