

Findings and Opinions for the College Achieve Public Schools and the Expansion of College Achieve Asbury Park Campus to Include Kindergarten Through Grade 12

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Introduction

The Intent of this report is to support College Achieve Greater Asbury Charter School's application to extend their existing Use Variance for a K-8 public school to a K-12 public school. This report will specifically address concerns raised by the Neptune Board concerning College Achieve Public School (CAPS) elementary students sharing a campus with CAPS high school students. The findings of the report will center on three core questions:

1. What are the advantages and disadvantages of a kindergarten through grade 12 single building configuration?
2. Whether a kindergarten through grade 12 single building configuration has been adopted anywhere in New Jersey or in the country?
3. Whether a kindergarten through grade 12 single building configuration presents safety issues for younger students that would not be present in a building solely dedicated to elementary grades.

Qualifications of the Expert

Dr. Robin Knutelsky has been in public education as an educator for thirty-two (32) years. Her experience in education began as a high school English teacher (10 years), she then became a K-12 Supervisor of Language Arts for fourteen (14) years. In 2015, Dr. Knutelsky took a position as director, then chief, at the New Jersey Department of Education where she served for three (3) years. Most recently, she is the District Director of Curriculum,

Instruction, Assessment, and Human Resources. Dr. Knutelsky has served in this position in a high school district in Bergen County for the last four (4) years.

Dr. Knutelsky earned her Bachelor's Degree from The College of New Jersey, then Trenton State College, in 1991 in English with a certification to teach English in grades K-12. In 1999, she earned her Masters of Education in Administration and Supervision from Rutgers University through the Graduate School of Education. Most recently, Dr. Knutelsky graduated from Saint Peter's University where she defended her dissertation in August and earned her Ed.D. in Higher Education.

Her skills and knowledge relevant to this opinion include her ability to compile and conduct research, her wide experience in teaching high school, and her ability to lead in K-12 school districts particular to New Jersey. Her deep and wide experience in the understanding of systems and schools relevant to curriculum, instruction, assessment, professional development, climate, culture, and accountability are of particular strength. Dr. Knutelsky has consulted with a number of independent companies regarding curriculum, instruction, and professional learning.

Background and Information Regarding This Expert Opinion

College Achieve Public Schools has a growing number of campuses that prepare students for college and beyond. At the Greater Asbury location, there are two different campuses. The Neptune Campus houses the K-8 program and the Asbury Park Campus houses the 9-12 program. The CAPS Central location maintains three different campuses including the Emerson Campus that holds the K-3 program, the South Campus that houses the grade 4-8 program and the Westervelt Campus that holds the grades 9-12 program. Finally,

the Paterson Campus has three separate campuses as well. The Market Street Campus houses the K-5 program, the Ellison St. Campus holds the 6-8 program and the Colt Street Campus houses the high school or grades 9-12 campus. The mission at College Achieve Public Schools maintains that “Every scholar at College Achieve Public Schools will be prepared to excel in and graduate from the top colleges or universities in the nation.” Presently, College Achieve Public Schools serves three communities by providing a superior K-12 education. CAPS pledges to “achieve this mission by recognizing and developing each child’s unique gifts and talents.” Additionally, they “promise to always treat [their] scholars and their families with respect and work together with them.”

In Neptune, CAPS has a long-term lease at the former Holy Innocents Catholic school that is currently used as a K-8 facility. College Achieve Public Schools is seeking to expand its use from a K-8 to K-12.

Issues and Research Questions that Frame the Issues Addressed

There are a number of issues that may be of consideration when determining success for students operating in a K-12 system. Of these considerations, of particular interest are the following: consistent school culture, smoother transitions for students from middle school to high school, consistent mentorships for students and models of behavior that benefits students. Additionally, students may benefit from consistent social and academic support, and a shared mission and vision. There is research that supports these considerations as best practices in public schools today. Some of that research is presented here to inform this expert opinion.

An analysis of single school districts, with all grade levels it serves in a single school building was completed. There are 260 single school districts in New Jersey. This research

study is only considering public schools (this is inclusive of charter schools). A random sampling of single school districts was determined to be representative of the full sample size. The random sampling included 35 single school districts of multiple configurations that include charter and regular schools. The researcher considered the New Jersey Department of Education's release of the 2021-2022 School Performance Reports that details "Climate and Environment" as a category. Within this category on each school and district's School Performance Report, there is a sub-category for "Discipline" and specifically "Violence, Vandalism, HIB and Substance Offenses." The New Jersey Department of Education collects data through the Student Safety Data System (SSDS) by which each school district is required to report on. The researcher was able to rank order the sampling of districts based on the number of incidents per 100 students. An analysis of this random sampling will inform this expert opinion.

The researcher also completed a school visit to tour each facility for the grade level band it serves. The researcher visited both current sites including entering many classrooms, the opportunity to talk with the administrative team, tour the gym and other common areas such as the cafeteria. This site visit will also inform this expert opinion.

Documents, Evidence, Research and Facts

The aforementioned three research questions will frame the review of current research of this report. The intent of the research questions is to guide inquiry specific to the findings of this expert opinion. According to McEntire (2002), cites Paglin and Fager (1997) there continues to be a host of questions about grade configurations and what grade configurations best serve students. New Jersey does not have a consistent grade configuration from town to town or city to city as indicated in the research found herein. Space, enrollment, budget and

vision for education are among some of the factors that determine a school district's grade configuration.

Research Question 1: What are the advantages and disadvantages of a kindergarten through grade 12 single building configuration?

McEntire (2002) compiled research that there are advantages and disadvantages to different grade configurations. She finds that transitions from grade levels that divide students require transitions from program to program. When these transitions occur, McEntire (2002) cites Alspaugh (1999) and found that there is significant achievement loss during transition years. This occurs when transitioning from a K-5 school to a 6-8 grade school and then from 9-12. McEntire also finds that there are negative participation rates and self-esteem when elementary students transitioned from an elementary school setting to a middle school setting. This research supports a cohesive K-12 configuration of grades in a single school district in order to limit students transitioning from grade level to grade level. According to this research, a K-12 school configuration may increase self-esteem, increase participation rates, and increase achievement due to all of these being affected when students transition from one grade level to the next in each school.

Sackville 20/20 (2018) conducted comprehensive research in "When K-12 Students Share a Campus: Looks at the Research." This research was conducted both in K-12 single school districts in Canada and in the United States. The Sackville research confirmed McEntire's research in that a K-12 campus may result in "increased parental and family member involvement, better attendance, improved behavior, healthier social adjustment and sense of belonging as well as increased academic achievement" (2018). The Presidio School

is a proponent of the K-12 single school district model and sees this success and advantages as evidenced in increased test scores that are well above the state levels. This research also found that the “campus is virtually free of violence” (2018). In Vancouver, Canada, a K-12 configuration contributes to “knowing our students well” and they attribute this to the students being “more likely to thrive.” (2018). Howley (2002) finds that the “K-12 model boosts academic achievement, especially for middle schoolers.” The research suggests that when a school district replicates this model, they too may experience similar findings.

According to Krueger and Rainwater (2003), the goal of PK-16 education is for students to “succeed as citizens and workers.” This research supports that school districts “think about education as one system of related, interdependent parts instead of as several isolated sectors.” A PK or K-12 single-school district allows for there to be related and “interdependent parts” and programs for students to achieve. Krueger and Rainwater suggest that to “establish such” a “cohesive, unified system” is necessary (2003). Krueger and Rainwater find that “early learning systems need to partner” with all stakeholders, including local districts and state education representatives to “help ease student transitions at the critical benchmarks” (2003). Krueger and Rainwater (2003) conclude that each “educational sector” (preschool, K-12 and post secondary) “must learn to view itself as part of one integrated, coherent system.” In the article by Krueger and Rainwater cite several national movements and resources that support the school to college alignment. These resources include Achieve, Inc., The American Diploma Project, The Bridge Project: Strengthening K-16 Transition Policies, The Early College High School Initiative, The Education Commission of the States, The Education Trust, and Standards for Success.

Regarding school districts, Lee and Smith refer to two different structures prevalent in schools today. These two structures are the “social structure” and the “organizational structure” (1993, p. 166). The organization structure refers to “specialization of tasks, routines of procedures and the management” of complex tasks of instructing students. The social structure refers to “enduring, orderly and patterned relationship between members (student to teacher, teacher to teacher, teacher to principal, and student to student).” Lee and Smith’s study is centered on “how teaching and learning occur” as a social construct as a series of “interactions” (1993, p.166). In the summary of their findings, Lee and Smith find that restructuring middle grade schools, “that encourage team teaching evidenced higher achievement” (p. 180). They also found that “less grouping by ability and a less rigid departmental structure appear to promote social equality in achievement” (1993, p. 180). This study also confirms that the K-8 study done by Eccles, Lord and Midgley (1991) are “more personal than most junior high schools.” Finally, Lee and Smith state:

In sum, our results lend empirical support to the movement to restructure the schools attended by early adolescents. Changes that make schools less like comprehensive high schools and more like "small societies" are in order. Students who attend schools that are less bureaucratically structured demonstrate somewhat higher achievement and more engagement, and the distribution of these outcomes is somewhat more equitable in such schools. As well as such common thrusts of the restructuring reform movement as less tracking and ability grouping, more team teaching, and a less-segmented curriculum in terms of academic departments, the study also provides empirical support for altering the education of young adolescents from grouping them in

schools with large numbers of eighth graders (schools devoted exclusively to the middle grades), so that students of this age interact more intensely with a smaller number of peers, especially with those who are younger or older than they are. (1993, p. 182)

This is confirmed in Lindner (2009) as cited in Sackville 20/20 (2019) that the K-12 single school district configuration supports extended learning in cross-grade activities, mentoring where students benefit from peer-tutoring, and “academic outcomes that were comparable or better than students in other grade organizational structures.”

Buddin and Zimmer (2005) in their research on “Student Achievement in Charter Schools: A Complex Picture” identified four categories of schools. This study looked at a broad number of charter schools in the United States. One of the challenges in evaluating success in charter schools, according to Buddin and Zimmer is that there is “no single charter school approach” as charter schools have different educational programs, curricula, instruction and have very different school settings (2005, p.352). This study also looked at classroom-based conversion schools, classroom-based conversion charter schools, as well as non-classroom based charter schools. This research echoes other schools in New Jersey as there is not just one single-school approach regarding grade level configurations. By the very nature of charter schools in New Jersey, they are set up to be different from other public schools.

Franklin and Glascock (1996) found that when comparing a 9-12 school district configuration to a K-12 configuration, the K-12 school configuration had more positive outcomes, particularly in the area of student persistence or conduct. The Presidio School’s finding that the K-12 configuration “has a significant impact on children’s academic

achievement as well as social and emotional well-being” (2018). This is further confirmed by the Buddin and Zimmer’ study done by Solmon, Park and Garcia (2001), in their two-year study of student achievement of Arizona charter schools. They found that students who spend two to three years in charter schools “out performed conventional public school students” (p. 355). In a different study, the relative age of the charter also had an impact on student data and performance. Charter schools with two or more years of experience “produced better academic outcomes.”

Conclusion

The research presented demonstrates the best practice and significant advantages in a K-12 configuration. Students who are enrolled in one coherent, well-articulated K-12 school system, experience less transitions between grade levels. There are school community advantages as a K-12 configuration and this leads to greater parental engagement, students who are more confident with more personalized learning. When students stay in a K-12 system, teachers, administrators, and families have sustained, long-lasting relationships with one another that have strong positive academic outcomes. These advantages are rooted in the research provided.

Research Question 2: Whether a kindergarten through grade 12 single building configuration has been adopted anywhere in New Jersey or in the country?

According to the National Center for Education Statistics and their 2021-2022 school district data, there are 260 single school building districts in New Jersey. Of the 260 school districts that occupy a single school building, 27 span from pre-kindergarten or kindergarten

through high school. Seven (7) of the school districts are pre-kindergarten or kindergarten through grade 12. Seventeen school districts span grades kindergarten through grade 12. Three (3) school districts span kindergarten through grade 10 and one is through grade 11. While the single school district buildings are found throughout the state of New Jersey, 22% of the districts are found in Camden County, Both Essex and Passaic counties represent 15% of the school districts. See chart side. For a listing of all the single school districts that represent K or PreK through grade 12, see Appendix A.

Conclusion

With a focus only on New Jersey school districts, there are 27 single school districts that span Pre-Kindergarten or Kindergarten through high school grade levels. College Achieve Public Schools, Asbury Campus, is located in Monmouth County. This indicates that CAPS is not seeking a configuration outside of what currently exists in other New Jersey school districts throughout the state.

Research Question 3: Whether a kindergarten through grade 12 single building configuration presents safety issues for younger students that would not be present in a building solely dedicated to elementary grades.

In considering this research question, the Annual Performance Reports for all school districts can be found on the New Jersey Department of Education's website; this served as the basis when considering this research question. There are 260 single school building districts in New Jersey. Of the 260 districts, seven are considered “commissions” that are typically special needs schools that serve entire counties. These schools were eliminated from the random sampling due their service to specialized populations of students.

A random sample of at least thirty (30) school districts satisfies the sample size in order to increase the confidence interval that warrants a fair and rational sample size in order to draw conclusions for the purpose of this report. Beginning with 39 single school districts, four (4) single school districts were eliminated from the random sampling as they had no data reported. Thirty-five (35) single school districts out of 253 in New Jersey represents 13.8% of the population thus validating the sample size as representative as the typical research sample standard is 10% of the total population. This random sampling includes charter as well as “regular” public schools. It is important to remember that charter schools are considered public schools as well.

As previously mentioned, there are no clear standards for the grade band configurations for school districts in New Jersey. In the sampling, see below to understand the type of school district with regards to grade bands. See Appendix A for a full listing of single school districts that have been rank-ordered.

Furthermore, when comparing school districts, it may be significant to further understand the school districts based on “locale.” There is a range of single school districts represented including large suburban districts (10), rural districts (8), large “city” districts (5) and small “city” districts (4) as well as midsize suburban districts (2). Additionally, two school districts were labeled as “Rural: Distant” (1) and “Town: Fringe” (1). This sampling represents all types of locales found within the full population of school districts in New Jersey.

In review of the New Jersey School Performance Reports, the public can review the number of incidents of violence, vandalism, HIB, and substance offenses. These incidents are collected annually. Additionally, there is a calculation that considers the number of incidents regarding school safety per 100 students. The above sampling was rank-ordered based on the incidents per 100 students enrolled. This will be used to answer the aforementioned research question.

The thirty-five (35) school districts in this sampling can be rank-ordered based on the incidents per 100 students enrolled. This rank order was further categorized as “low,” “medium,” or “high” number of safety incidents per 100 students enrolled. Based on the random sampling the “low” range has been determined to reflect from 1 to .58 incidents per 100 students enrolled; there are twelve (12) single school districts in this range. In the

“medium” category, there are eleven (11) single school districts and this range runs from .77 to 2.52 incidents per 100 students enrolled. Finally, the “high” category has a range of 2.72 to 9.63 incidents per 100 students enrolled and there are twelve (12) single school districts in this category.

The single school data can be disaggregated further as “regular” local (as indicated in the sampling) or as “charter.” Of the elementary single school districts in this sampling, six (6) are charter and ten (10) are regular. The middle school sampling has one (1) charter and one (1) regular. There is only one junior high school district, composed of grades 7-12, represented in this sample and it is identified as a charter school. The high school only districts in this sampling have one (1) charter school and eight (8) regular school districts. Of the seven PK or K through high school single high school districts, five (5) are charters and two (2) are regular.

For this research question, it should be considered whether a kindergarten through grade 12 single building configuration presents safety issues for younger students that would not be present in a building solely dedicated to elementary grades. This data is presented in percentages to show the relative proportions to one another when not all types of single school districts are equally represented in this random sample. Due to the number of school districts in the random sample as compared to the whole group, statistically, the percentages in the sample are representative of the whole with some degree of variation. By reviewing both types of school district (regular and charter) and configurations (elementary, middle, junior high, high school only or PK or K through high school), and then determining the category of ranked safety issues, the following results were found.

When considering elementary single school districts, as identified as regular school districts, 80% of the sampling were ranked in the low category and 20% were found to be ranked in the medium category. The elementary charter schools ranked 33% in each category of low, medium and high. In the middle school configuration of single school districts 100% of the regular schools fell in the high category. Inversely, 100% of charter schools fell in the low category. Of the junior high school configuration 100% of the school districts in this random

sample is a charter school and is categorized in the medium category. Where high school single districts were ranked by low, medium and high numbers of incidents per 100 students, 38% of the regular school districts were ranked in the medium range and 63% were ranked in the high range. Of the high school only single charter school districts, 100% of the schools in this category fell in the medium range. Finally, when considering PK or K through grade 12 single school districts, 50% of the regular school districts were ranked in the medium range and 50% were ranked in the high range of incidents per 100 students enrolled. The ranking results for charter schools in this category is slightly different where 20% of the single school districts fell in the low range, 40% fell in the medium range and 40% were ranked in the high range.

Conclusion

It is of significance that if CAPS was part of the representative sample, they would rank in the low end of the categorized safety at .46 incidents per 100 students enrolled. There is only one other K-12 single school district in this low end of the rank order. Based on this data, the random sampling and where CAPS currently ranks, it can be determined that kindergarten through grade 12 single building configuration does not necessarily present safety issues for younger students that would not be present in a building solely dedicated to elementary grades. Overall, in all grade level configurations, charter schools were more likely to have a “lower” number of incidents per 100 students than the “regular” school districts. The complete rank-order list can be found in Appendix A.

On-Site Visit College Achieve Public Schools

During the tour of the facility on Monday, May 8, 2023, the researcher was buzzed into the building and sent directly to the front office. With regards to security, health and welfare, it was shared that students enter the building through different doors depending on their age range. All the buses have video, and students have assigned seats. There were security personal that circulated throughout the buildings. Currently, this is typical in school settings to promote student safety.

During the administrative meeting, the school district as a community school was demonstrated. Students were smiling, teachers were engaged, the hallways were clear, students were appropriately dressed. In most cases, there were two teachers in each classroom whether it was a special education teacher, a teacher in training or an ESL teacher. The plan for separate floors for the high school and elementary school was discussed as well

as the scheduling of common areas to minimize high school and elementary school interactions. It was pointed out that the current configuration and positioning of security guards, hall monitors and school staff would ensure that interactions between students are closely monitored. All students on this campus will have access to fields and programs as appropriate for each grade level and will be scheduled accordingly. As 99% percent of students in attendance are on free and reduced lunch, they all eat pre-packaged meals supplied through the cafeteria services and students do not leave campus.

On the day of this particular visit, students and families were getting passports for the annual "Trip of a Lifetime" program. This was orderly and well executed for students and families to have this opportunity to travel abroad. It was also shared that there are other community building opportunities for the students including participating in brush cleanup, Boys and Girls Clubs, and working in area nursing homes.

Additionally, there is a focus on dual enrollment programs through Brookdale College and Saint Elizabeth College. In dual enrollment courses, students can earn college credits simultaneously when earning high school credit for a very low cost. Students also earn college credits through AP courses offered to 11th and 12th grade students.

On a tour of the facility, classrooms were clean and organized and furniture was appropriately sized for students in their age groups. The cafeteria is large and accommodates a music program when not serving lunch. The gymnasium is also spacious. On the Asbury Park campus, right now where the high school classes are being held, the rooms are a little smaller. The cafeteria, while functioning, is smaller and the gymnasium is not regulation size (useful for high school basketball). On the other hand the Asbury Park campus might be better suited for middle school students where middle schools tend to operate in team structures.

Conclusion

Elements of success were easily seen during the site visit. There were school and community connections in the passport program. School security to promote student safety was clearly visible. Student engagement was high and teachers were actively teaching. Students had highly engaging materials and teachers were using a variety of instructional settings including small groups, full class instruction, 1:1 instruction and pairs teaching.

Conclusion

Reflecting on Krueger and Rainwater (2003), whether a school district has one school building or several school buildings that make up one school district, their research indicates the value of a single vision or cohesive plan for school districts. This is imperative for a variety of reasons. This includes shared stakeholders, shared mission and vision, policies and regulations that provide governance, cohesive instruction and programming, and comprehensive shared support services. Krueger and Rainwater (2003) conclude that each “educational sector” (preschool, K-12 and post secondary) “must learn to view itself as part of one integrated, coherent system.” The College Achieve Public Schools system is suggesting expanding their unified and coherent K-12 system, all on one campus. Many other local school communities share this same understanding in the design of their single school district system. There are 270 of the single school districts in New Jersey.

Valerie Lee and Julia Smith, in “Effects of School Restructuring on Achievement and Engagement of Middle-grade Students” state that “reform is needed at all levels, but calls for changings schools serving early adolescents are especially strong” (1993). College Achieve

Public Schools is looking to continue with the reform of a K-12 system by planning on bringing the high school students to the Neptune campus from the Asbury Park campus.

The work by Lee and Smith (1993) “provides empirical support for altering the education of young adolescents from grouping them in schools with large numbers of eighth graders (schools devoted exclusively to the middle grades), so that students of this age interact more intensely with a smaller number of peers, especially with those who are younger or older than they are (p. 182). This research supports a PK or K through 12 system that allows for interplay of students of various grade levels. This allows for mentoring, tutoring and effective role-modeling for multi-aged students. This aligns to the mission and pledge at College Achieve Public Schools where students set their sights on top colleges and develop “each student’s gifts.” This happens in school districts over time and throughout grade levels.

According to Buddin and Zimmer, “Startup schools are new entities that acquire facilities, faculty, and students at their inception” (2005, p. 352). For the purposes of this opinion, only classroom-based “start-up” charter schools were considered as this the type of charter school that more closely fits the College Achieve Public School Charter Schools.

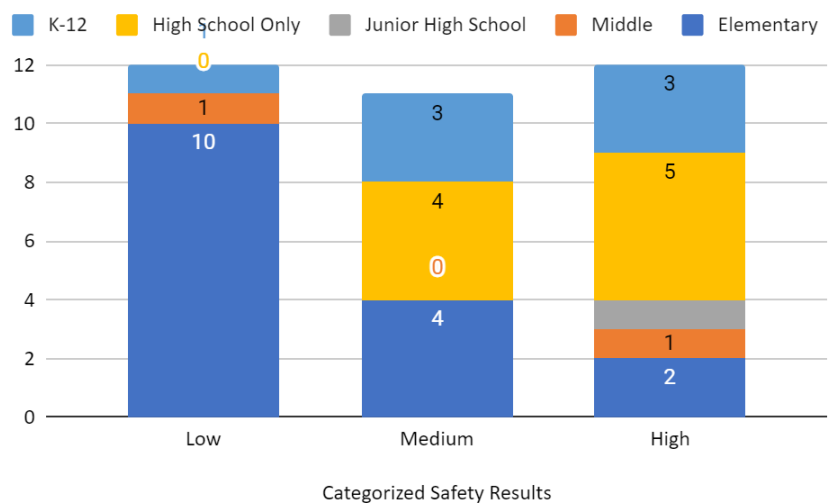
A direct comparison between charter schools and conventional public schools is often imbalanced. Charter school students are often NOT a random sampling of public school students in the state according to Buddin and Zimmer. There are over 600 school districts in New Jersey. Twenty-seven are single school districts in New Jersey with only twelve (12) of the twenty-one (21) counties in New Jersey represented. It is important to note the school districts vary greatly in New Jersey based on facilities, local budgets, communities, etc. In Buddin and Zimmer, they accounted for student background, school specific effects and grade cohorts with the school as controls for factors other than that of charter statutes that are likely

to affect student achievement (2005, p. 361). Their analysis “suggests that start-up classroom-based charter schools provide the greatest promise of improving performance” (p. 369). CAPS is a “start-up classroom-based charter school.”

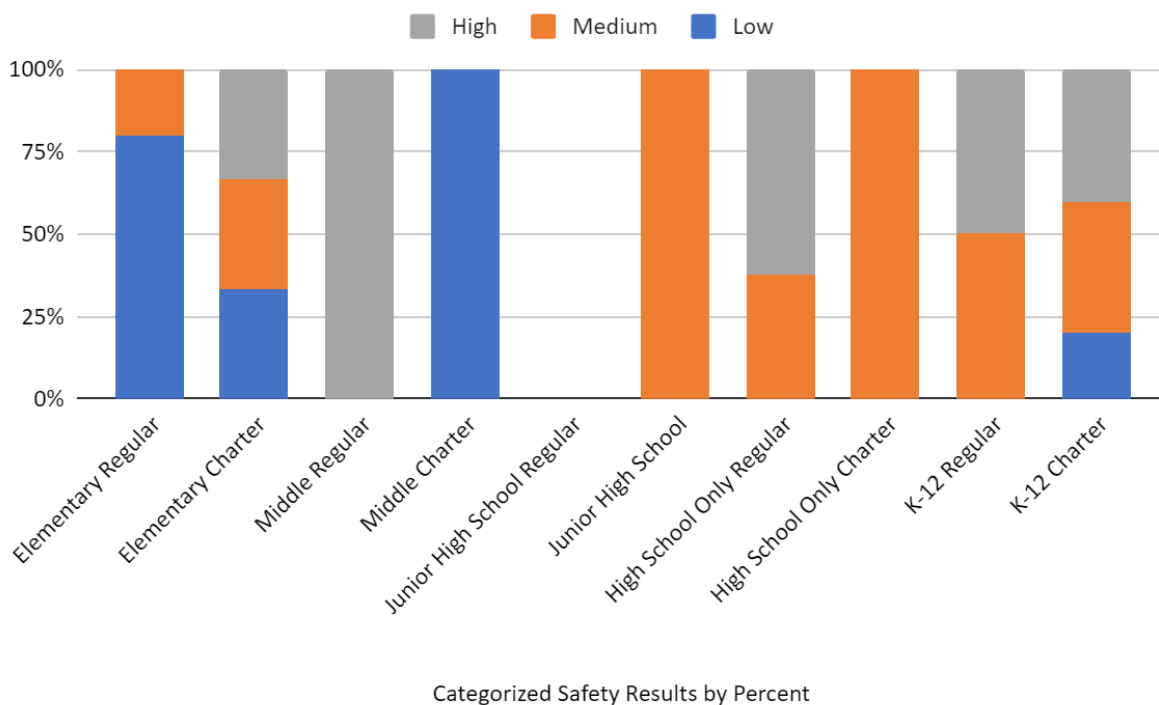
The Presidio School, found in “When K-12 Students Share a Campus” shared successes found as evidenced in increased test scores that are well above the state levels (Sackville 20/20, 2018). New Jersey sets targets for achievement based on standardized testing. Additionally, New Jersey sets growth targets so that school districts can show that they are moving towards higher levels of achievement in incremental ways. In the school years for 2019-2020 and 2020-2021, students in New Jersey did not take state assessments due to the canceling of these assessments due to COVID-19. For the 2021-2022 school year, College Achieve Public Schools Asbury Campus, met target goals and exceeded growth goals. CAPS students exceed the state achievement average in English Language Arts.

Based on the 2023 School District Performance Reports regarding 2021-2022 data, the CAPS Asbury district fell in this low range at .46 incidents per 100 students. See below for the types of single school districts that fell in each range. In a review of the chart to the right, there are ten (10) elementary schools, one (1) middle school and one (1) K-12 single school district.

While CAPS was left out of the sampling intentionally, it is clear that ranking in the low end of the 100 incidents per 100 students is impressive and not typical of other K-12 single school districts of the random sampling.



Well within the scope of this research question is to consider how like-grade level grouped single school district schools “stack up” when compared to one another. In the graph below, In three of the four configurations (elementary charter, middle charter and K-12 charter), there are single school districts in the random sampling that are rank-ordered in the low range. Therefore, it is reasonable to show that charter schools, on the whole, are among the lowest when rank-ordered and compared with regular school districts.



The advantages of a PK or K-12 single school system allow for a cohesive and aligned approach to education in order to achieve greater outcomes. Some of these advantages include articulated skill development that is not based on birth year but rather as students are ready. This is particularly important in developmental math skills as students progress through algebra. Some students are ready for algebra in grade 6 and others in grade 9. A K-12 program, in one school district, allows for greater access to higher, more rigorous courses.

Secondly, additional access to student support services, guidance counselors, counseling services, and social emotional programming are better aligned and systematic in a K-12 system that allows a school district to deploy services where they are needed in a timely and responsible fashion. While this is true for emergency needs, and of utmost importance, a K-12 single school district can also build programs and capacity at each grade level band that is well articulated and engineered in a way that meets the developmental needs of students by grade band. In the area of nutrition and making healthy choices, what does this “look like” in K-2, 3-5, 6-8 and 9-12. Additionally all grade level bands can co-create content and projects like a community build “farm to table” garden.

Opinion of the Expert

My review of the information made available to me as of the date of this report, based upon a reasonable degree of professional certainty, supports the conclusion that the students of the College Achieve Public Schools would be best served by being allowed to exist as a single school district and join the other single school districts in New Jersey who have experienced success in this model. It is clear that the administrative team, teachers, and students feel great pride in their school system and are committed to its future success. This opinion is supported in current research, recent data, a sampling of data, an in-person visit to the facility as well as the past experience of the expert.
